# Late representations received -

Officers have been asked to clarify the relationship between the proposed site and the existing play area and playing field. The plan below shows the connection from the proposed site (outlined in red) with the existing playing field and play area within the north western boundary (outlined in blue).



Late representation received -

A late response from the Councils Biodiversity Officer has been received which informs that the hedgerow to be removed to create the access is classed as an 'important' hedgerow (as defined by the Hedgerow Regulations 1997).

The criteria for determining 'important' hedgerows includes that the hedgerow:

a) has existed for 30 years or more;

CPAT advised that the hedgerow is visible on the 1st ed Ordnance Survey mapping and so is considered to be over 30 years old.

And;

b) satisfies at least one of the criteria listed in Part II of Schedule 1

The hedgerow satisfied criteria 7.a) on average in a 30m length, at least 7 woody shrub and tree species listed in the regulations

The Council's Biodiversity Officer confirmed that the woody species in this hedgerow are hawthorn (Crataegus monogyna), blackthorn (Prunus spinosa), ash (Fraxinus excelsior), elder (Sambucus nigra), rose (Rosa species), hazel (Corylus avellana), and holly (Ilex aquifolium).

# Additional Information – None.

**Officer Note** – Officers have considered the response of the Councils Biodiversity Officer, the Hedgerow Regulations 1997 and relevant planning case law.

Planning case law makes it clear that the Local Planning Authority must consider the 'importance' of hedgerows when determining a planning application which includes the removal of a hedgerow. There is a general duty on LPA's to require the retention of a hedgerow which meets the definition of 'important' (as defined in the Hedgerow Regulations 1997), unless there is a good reason to justify its removal. It follows therefore that a planning authority should not grant planning permission for any works relating to the loss of such a hedgerow, unless there is a similarly good reason – ie the impact of a proposal on any important hedgerow is a material consideration which carries significant weight.

Members of the Planning Committee are advised by the Councils Biodiversity Officer that the hedgerow to be removed as part of this proposal is classed as 'important' (as defined in the Hedgerow Regulations 1997).

As the hedgerow is classed as 'important' the planning authority must have good planning reasons to allow the removal of hedgerow.

In Officers opinion, given the recommendation to refuse planning permission based on unjustified loss of Best Most Versatile Agricultural land, it should follow that the loss of an 'important' hedgerow is also unjustified.

Officers therefore suggest that the unjustified loss of an important hedgerow should form the basis of a second reason for refusal.

# Additional reason for refusal -

2. It is the opinion of the Local Planning Authority that the proposal would result in the unjustified loss of a section of hedgerow which is classed as 'important' (as defined by the Hedgerow Regulations 1997). The proposal is therefore contrary to Planning Policy Wales (Edition 11) paragraphs 6.4.24 and 6.4.25.
