5 STRATEGAETH PARTH CYHOEDDUS AR GYFER SIR DDINBYCH

Cafodd copi o adroddiad Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol Cwsmeriaid, sy'n gofyn am farn y Pwyllgor ar strwythur a chynnwys Strategaeth Parth Cyhoeddus ddrafft y Cyngor, Atodiad 1, ei gylchredeg gyda phapurau'r cyfarfod.

Cyflwynodd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd a Phennaeth Cynllunio a Gwarchod y Cyhoedd yr adroddiad. Eglurwyd bod yr Archwiliad Mewnol i reolaeth part cyhoeddus wedi argymhell i llunio strategaeth i gael eglurder a chydlyniad ynglŷn â sut mae'r Cyngor yn delio gyda'r maes pwysig yma. Mae ail argymhelliaid yn nodi bod angen gwell cydweithio rhwng gwasanaethau allweddol a dull mwy corfforaethol ar gyfer cynllunio ac ymateb i faterion sy'n gysylltiedig â pharth cyhoeddus.

Cafodd y Strategaeth Parth Cyhoeddus ddrafft ei datblygu mewn gweithdy yn dilyn ymchwil i strategaethau tebyg yng Nghymru a thu hwnt. Mae'r ddogfen strategol yn diffinio beth yw part cyhoeddus a sut gall y Cyngor reoli a dylanwadu ar y gwaith. Mae'r Strategaeth yn diffinio pwysigrwydd gweithio mewn partneriaeth wrth weithredu newid sy'n gwella part cyhoeddus.

Mae rôl a chyfrifoldeb aelodau allweddol Archwilio, Grwpiau Ardal yr Aelodau a swyddogion allweddol wedi eu diffinio. Mae pedair egwyddor strategol wedi eu hadnabod, sef:-

- Parth Cyhoeddus sy'n gyraeddadwy a chyda cysylltiadau da
- Amgylchedd glân a thaclus
- Cadw a datblygu hunaniaeth leol
- Amgylchedd diogel

Mae disgrifiadau manwl o'r pedair egwyddor strategol wedi eu hamlinellu yn y ddogfen ddrafft, ynghyd ag enghreifftiau o ddatblygiadau diweddar. Byddai'r Strategaeth yn cynorthwyo i gyflawni Blaenoriaethau Corfforaethol "Strydoedd Glân a Thaclus" a "Datblygu'r Economi Leol" a byddai'n effeithio ar drigolion, gweithwyr ac ymwelwyr Sir Ddinbych. Rhagwelir y bydd y rhan fwyaf o'r gwaith o ran darparu'r Strategaeth o fewn y cyllidebau gwasanaeth cyfredol ac o fewn y gyllideb sydd wedi ei neilltuo yn y Cynllun Corfforaethol ar gyfer y ddwy flaenoriaeth uchod.

Hyd yma rydym ni wedi ymgynghori â swyddogion perthnasol o'r gwasanaethau amrywiol sy'n ymdrin â Pharth Cyhoeddus, yr Aelod Arweiniol a'r Uwch Dîm Arweinyddiaeth. Mae'r Cynghorau Tref, Dinas a Chymuned, y sector gwirfoddol a Chyfoeth Naturiol Cymru wedi derbyn copïau o'r sylwadau hefyd.

Pwysleisiodd y Cyng. J.M. Davies yr angen i gynnwys cyfeiriad cyffredinol at ddiwylliant y Cyngor mewn perthynas â chynnwys unigolion yn y mecanwaith adrodd. Eglurodd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd y byddai manylion y newidiadau o ran cael pwynt cyswllt unigol yn cael eu cyflwyno yng Ngweithdy'r Aelodau Arweiniol ym mis Hydref.

Soniodd y Cyng. H.O. Williams am y gwaith caled sydd wedi ei wneud i fynd i'r afael â baw cŵn yn ei Ward. Amlygodd y Cyng. R.M. Murray a P.A. Evans y problemau sydd i'w gweld yn eu wardiau nhw. Amlinelloedd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd yr anawsterau o ran dal troseddwyr. Fodd bynnag, pwysleisiodd bod

gwasanaethau yn gweithio mewn partneriaeth i fynd i'r afael â'r mater hwn a chyfeiriodd at yr Ymgyrch Atal Baw Cŵn a lansiwyd ym mis Chwefror 2013.

Ymatebodd Pennaeth Cynllunio a Gwarchod y Cyhoedd i gwestiwn gan y Cynghorydd J.M. Davies a chyfeiriodd at dudalen 7 y Strategaeth, Canllawiau ar gyfer Hunaniaeth Leol yn y Parth Cyhoeddus, sy'n cydnabod y cwmpas ar gyfer gweithio mewn partneriaeth ac ymgynghori gyda Chynghorau Tref a Chymuned ac sy'n cyfeirio'n benodol at arwyddion a dodrefn stryd.

Cefnogodd y Cadeirydd y Strategaeth ond amlygodd yr angen i gynnwys proses ar gyfer asesu llwyddiant a mesur canlyniadau a chynnydd a chynnwys trefnau ar gyfer adrodd a chyfathrebu. Amlygodd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd yr anawsterau o ran mesur cynnydd rhai elfennau o'r Strategaeth, e.e. newid diwylliannol. Eglurodd Pennaeth Cynllunio a Gwarchod y Cyhoedd bod Strategaeth Parth Cyhoeddus yn ddogfen strategol ac y byddai angen gweithredu proses neu fecanwaith ychwanegol i fesur cynnydd.

Yn dilyn y drafodaeth a ddilynwyd, darparwyd yr ymatebion canlynol i gwestiynau a materion a godwyd gan yr Aelodau:-

- Rhoddwyd gwybod i'r aelodau na fydd beicwyr yn cael eu gorfodi i ddefnyddio llwybrau beicio sydd wedi eu darparu fel llwybr amgen i briffordd. Eglurodd y Cyng. C.H. Williams bod beicio ar balmentydd yn drosedd ond nad yw'r camau gorfodi'n cael eu cymryd yn aml iawn. Dylid annog unigolion sy'n beicio yn eu hamser hamdden i ddefnyddio llwybrau beicio.
- Mewn ymateb i bryderon ynglŷn â gweddillion torri cloddiau yn achosi pynjars ac yn atal beicwyr rhag defnyddio rhai llwybrau beicio, eglurodd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd, yn yr achosion lle mae gan y Cyngor cytundeb â'r perchnogion i dorri cloddiau, bod y cytundeb hefyd yn cynnwys clirio'r gweddillion o'r llwybrau beicio.
- Eglurwyd nad yw'r Cyngor Sir yn gyfrifol am bob ardal chwarae. Mae rhai ardaloedd chwarae yn rhan o ddatblygiadau tai neu yng ngofal Cyngorau Tref neu Gymuned. Amlygodd yr Aelodau bwysigrwydd sicrhau, pan fo ardaloedd chwarae'n cael eu hadeiladu, eu bod yn cynnwys rhaglen gynnal a chadw llawn ac yn cael eu monitro'n ofalus. Holodd yr Aelodau ynglŷn â chynnwys materion cosmetig, fel peintio a thacluso, yn yr archwiliad blynnyddol o ardaloedd chwarae gan y byddai'r rhain yn gwella edrychiad ardaloedd chwarae a'u gwneud yn fwy deniadol i breswylwyr ac ymwelwyr. Eglurodd Pennaeth Cynllunio a Gwarchod y Cyhoedd, o ran cynllunio ac ar ôl ystyried y sefyllfa economaidd sydd ohoni, y byddai'n bwysig sicrhau cydbwysedd rhwng y ddarpariaeth o fannau agored ac ardaloedd chwarae a'r costau i ddarparwyr gwasanaethau eraill.
- Cyfeiriodd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd at gyflwyno trefnau arfaethedig i'w dilyn pan fo aelodau o'r cyhoedd yn methu torri neu gynnal a chadw clawdd sydd wedi gordyfu ac yn rhwystr i eraill. Rhoddwyd gwybod i'r Pwyllgor y byddai'r trefnau arfaethedig, a fyddai'n golygu anfon llythyr rhybudd i'r troseddwyr yn yr achos cyntaf, yn cael eu trafod yng Ngweithdy'r Aelodau ym mis Hydref.
- Cyfeiriodd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd at y ddadl bosib yn ymwneud â thorri neu drimio coed. Pwysleisiodd y Cadeirydd bod angen sicrhau bod Aelodau lleol yn derbyn yr wybodaeth ddiweddaraf ynglŷn â materion Parth Cyhoeddus yn eu wardiau.

- Roedd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd yn cydnabod pryderon yr Aelodau o ran gorchuddion gyliau. Eglurodd nad oedd anghenion cynnal a chadw wedi eu hystyried yn ystod y cam dylunio.
- Pwysleisiodd yr Aelodau yr angen i gael trefniadau adrodd a monitro Rheoli Cyswllt Cwsmer effeithiol i sicrhau effeithlonwydd y Strategaeth. Gofynnwyd hefyd am gynnwys rhai nodau ac amcanion lefel uchel yn y Strategaeth.

6 PARATOI AR GYFER CYNNAL A CHADW DROS Y GAEAF TYMOR 2013/14

Cafodd copi o'r adroddiad gan Bennaeth yr Amgylchedd, sy'n gofyn am sylwadau'r Aelodau ar drefniadau cynnal a chadw dros y gaeaf i ymdrin ag amodau tywydd gwael a garw ar ffyrdd y sir, ei gylchredeg gyda phapurau'r cyfarfod.

Mae'r adroddiad yn cynnwys gwybodaeth ar ddarparu llwybrau diogelach i drigolion y sir ac ar gadw'r sir ar agar pan fo tywydd garw. Gofynnwyd i'r Aelodau ystyried yr wybodaeth a rhoi sylwadau ar y trefniadau Cynnal a Chadw dros y Gaeaf a p'un ai ydynt yn ddigonol ar gyfer gaeaf cyffredin, gyda chynlluniau wrth gefn ar gyfer amodau mwy difrifol.

Mae mân newidiadau wedi eu gwneud i drefniadau cynnal a chadw dros y gaeaf ar gyfer 2013/14 ac mae'r adroddiad yn amlygu'r newidiadau a'r gwelliannau. Fodd bynnag, bydd arferion da'r blynnyddoedd blaenorol yn cael eu cadw. Bydd yr 11 llwybr graeanu yn cael eu cadw. Fodd bynnag nid yw'r llwybrau hyn yn adlewyrchu'r prif rwydwaith bws ac felly mae tri llwybr wedi eu diwygio a'u hymestyn i ddarparu gwell gwasanaeth yn y Cwm, Llangwyfan/Llangynhafal a Derwen/Clawddnewydd.

Ymatebodd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd i gwestiwn gan y Cyng. J.S. Welch a chadarnhaodd na fyddai dod â gwasanaeth bws Nantglyn i ben yn effeithio ar y llwybr graeanu yn yr ardal honno. Eglurodd hefyd y byddai nifer o lwybrau bysiau trefol yn cael eu trin yn ôl yr angen.

Byddai angen o leiaf 33 gyrrwr i fodloni gofynion y ddeddfwriaeth yn ymwneud ag oriau gweithio gyrrwr a byddai angen rhywfaint o yrwyr wrth gefn i ddarparu gwasanaethau ychwanegol. O ran cerbydau, bydd pedwar cerbyd graeanu ychwanegol i'r fflyd ac felly byddai yna dri cherbyd wrth gefn. Bydd nifer o Gontractwyr Amaethyddol yn dal i gael eu defnyddio i raeau'r ffyrdd gwledig pan fo eira. Bydd un yn graeanu yn ardal Llangollen a bydd o leiaf un ychwanegol yn graeanu yn ardal Bryneglwys. Bydd y gwasanaeth yn cael ei ymestyn ymhellach yn y blynnyddoedd nesaf.

Mae'r gwaith o osod llawr caled yn nepo Rhuthun wedi gwneud lle i fwy o raeau, a bydd mwy yn cael ei gludo yno wrth i'r tymor fynd rhagddo. Yn ystod y blynnyddoedd

diwethaf mae graean wedi ei drin wedi ei ddefnyddio yn nepo Cinmel. Fodd bynnag, oherwydd newidiadau i amlder a graddfeydd gwasgaru graean ac yn sgil adolygu'r costau, penderfynwyd defnyddio graean sych. Mae'r cyflenwr wedi adeiladu stoc strategol yn y chwarel yn Sir Gaer ac, yn ogystal, mae Llywodraeth Cymru yn adeiladu Storfa Graean Strategol yn Rhualt a byddai modd i Sir Ddinbych ei defnyddio os oes angen. Bydd ail-lenwi'r storfeydd a'r biniau graean yn dechrau ym mis Medi a bydd y gwaith wedi ei gwblhau cyn diwedd mis Hydref, gyda'r storfeydd a'r biniau wedyn yn cael eu hail-lenwi yn ôl yr angen.

Ni fydd y trefniadau arferol ar gyfer cadw golwg ar y tywydd a goruchwyllo 24 awr y dydd yn newid ond bydd modd eu cynyddu os oes angen. Bydd y strategaeth gyfathrebu effeithiol, sydd wedi ei datblygu dros y blynnyddoedd diwethaf ar y cyd â thîm Parth Cyhoeddus, yn cael ei defnyddio eto.

Mae darparu ffyrdd diogel i drigolion ac ymwelwyr yn flaenoriaeth i'r gwasanaeth ac felly mae darparu rhaglen gynnal a chadw effeithiol dros y gaeaf yn allweddol. Mae'r gyllideb sylfaenol o ddyraniad refeniw Priffyrrd (£709 mil) yn aros, gyda £226 mil ychwanegol wrth gefn ar gyfer tywydd garw iawn. Mewn ymateb i gwestiwn gan y Cyng. P.A. Evans, cadarnhaodd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd nad oedd tanwariant a phryderodd ynglŷn â'r swm wrth gefn pan fo tywydd garw. Yn sgil yr eira a'r rhew ym mis Mawrth bu gorfod defnyddio'r arian wrth gefn a bu i ddeng niwrnod o glirio eira gostio £176,000.

Mewn ymateb i gwestiwn gan y Cyng. C.H. Williams yn ymwneud â chlirio eira ar lonydd a ffyrdd preifat, darparodd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd fanylion ynglŷn â chyfrifoldebau'r Cyngor a'r Polisi Cynnal a Chadw dros y Gaeaf, ac eglurodd bod adain gynnal a chadw dros y gaeaf yn gweithio gyda'r Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol, os oes materion lles yn codi, a chyda mudiadau fel y Gwasanaeth Achub Mynydd a'r Groes Goch.

Ymatebodd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd i gwestiwn gan y Cyng. G.M. Kensler ac eglurodd bod Llywodraeth Cymru yn ad-dalu cost cynnal a chadw cefnffyrdd dros y gaeaf. Cadarnhaodd, pan fo tywydd garw, y byddai staff part h ymddygiad yn clirio eira yng nghanol trefi ac yn cysylltu â pherchnogion siopau i glirio manau cerdded. Cadarnhaodd Pennaeth yr Amgylchedd bod trefniadau graeanu yn eu lle gydag awdurdodau cyfagos.

Ar gais y Cadeirydd cytunwyd i gylchredeg adroddiad ar drefniadau'r Cyngor o ran mynd i'r afael â mân lifogydd a llifogydd cymedrol i Aelodau'r Pwyllgor.

TÎM CYRCHFAN, MARCHNATA A CHYFATHREBU – MODEL GWEITHREDU NEWYDD

Cafodd copi o adroddiad Pennaeth Cyfathrebu, Marchnata a Hamdden ei gylchredeg gyda phapurau'r cyfarfod.

Cyflwynodd Arweinydd Tîm Cyfathrebu a Rheoli Ymgyrchoedd yr adroddiad a oedd yn nodi'r prif newidiadau o ran ailstrwythuro Tîm Cyrchfan, Marchnata a Chyfathrebu Sir Ddinbych, model gweithredu newydd ei dîm a'r ffyrdd y bydd y gwasanaethau'n cael eu darparu gan y tîm i gyrraedd lefel gwell o berfformiad yn unol â gofynion y Cyngor. Cadarnhawyd y byddai'r adroddiad adolygu llenyddiaeth yn dilyn yn ddiweddarach oherwydd anawsterau yn ymwneud â'r rhaglen ddigwyddiadau a blaenoriaethau eraill dros yr haf.

Y peth allweddol sy'n cymell newid y gwasanaeth yw'r angen i ddarparu gwell perfformiad economaidd yn Sir Ddinbych trwy well marchnata a chyfathrebu, gan arwain at gynnydd mewn gweithgareddau economaidd, buddsoddiad a chreu swyddi. Y gofyniad allweddol arall ar gyfer newid yw'r angen i sicrhau adnoddau digonol ar gyfer y tîm newydd i sicrhau bod y perfformiad uwch yn bosibl ei gyflawni, gyda chapasiti'r tîm presennol eisoes wedi ei nodi fel mater i'w ystyried.

Crynhodd Arweinydd Tîm Twristiaeth, Marchnata a Digwyddiadau y prif egwyddorion ar gyfer newid (gwelwch Atodiad 2). What's going well?

Overall the project status is generally very good; however because the decision on the CPO is still awaited there has been little action in terms of acquisitions and re settlement because of this

Demolition of Nos 2-30 Gronant Street and 31 Gronant Street, scheduled for commencement in July has also suffered delay due to utility service disconnection delays. Also, a number of residents expressed concern regarding the potential dust created by the demolition during a hot dry spell. The demolitions are now scheduled to commence week commencing 23rd September 2013

The tender for the procurement of Landscape Designer for the Green Space was posted on Buy 4 Wales end of July with a return date of 6th September. All submissions for Stage 1 and 2 have come in lower than the budget threshold of £100,000 and are currently being evaluated under the Quality/Price ratio. Interviews are being held in Russell House of the 6 consultants who submitted tenders on Thursday 26th September when the successful contractor will be decided upon. The consultant is expected to contracted form the 1st November 2013 with the concept design prepared by mid January 2014 followed by detailed design mid March

The project has an extremely tight time schedule and is crucial that all target dates are achieved in order for construction to commence July 2014 to complete by March 2015

What concerns us and what are we doing about it?

The Project Delivery Confidence remains at yellow due to the progress of procurement of the Design Consultant, however the delay in receiving the outcome of the CPO process is hindering further progress. Representations have been made to the Planning Inspectorate regarding the urgency of a decision but unfortunately without the response we would have wished.

Due to the delay the resettlement programme will be under pressure, but the officer responsible continues to achieve results and should be commended for her sterling work. The situation is under constant review by the Project Team and the situation can be better managed and planned once the outcome of the CPO is known

Outlook

A number of risks remain, however these are considered and managed by the Project Co ordination Group as the project progresses.

What's going well?

The LEGO innovation centre on the ground floor of the refurbished Bee & Station was opened on 20th September.

What concerns us and what are we doing about it?

The Minister for Housing & Regeneration in the Welsh Government decided not to invite a second stage bid for Vibrant & Viable Places funding from the Rhyl Going Forward partnership. The Leader of the County Council has submitted a case to the Minister requesting him to reconsider his decision. If the Minister does not agree, there remains an opportunity to apply for part of a sum of £5m which has been set aside for unsuccessful applicants from the 10% most deprived areas in Wales but competition for these funds will be stiff as there are already seven potential applicants for the funds before the unsuccessful areas at Stage 2 of the main application process have been taken into account.

The Town Centre Manager left his post in August. The Town Centre Management Group has agreed that responsibility for delivering the town centre events programme should transfer to the County Council and that the County Council should be the host employer for any replacement post. Members of the Group have agreed to review the role and are looking at best practice from other towns to inform this process.

A task and finish group has been established to progress the development of a town centre strategy in conjunction with the development of a Town & Area Plan for Rhyl.

Outlook

Whilst the Minister's decision about the Vibrant & Viable Places application is extremely disappointing, there remains an opportunity to apply for the funding which has been ring-fenced for unsuccessful applicants and there will nevertheless be an opportunity to enhance this with match funding from the new European structural funds programme commencing in 2014 and deliver a significant investment programme in the town centre. The new arrangements for town centre management and the development of the strategy for the town centre will enable partners to work together effectively to secure a sustainable future for the town centre.

New Aquatic Centre and new use for the Sky Tower

Work continues on developing the business case for the County Council owned leisure facilities along the coast with the economic impact and financing options being assessed during the reporting period. A number of design options for the new Aquatic Centre have been considered and a detailed appraisal of the need for a 50m pool in Rhyl has been undertaken and this will be considered by the County Council on 8th October along with the revenue business plan projections.

The development of the new Aquatic Centre will require the relocation of the existing skatepark and it is recommended that the alternative proposals should be prepared in consultation with the young people of Rhyl. Ideas for the upgrading of the Nova in Prestatyn have been developed to ensure that the future 'offer' is complementary to the new Rhyl Aquatic Centre. Furthermore the plans for the new school in Rhyl will be developed in context with the existing Leisure Centre and proposed coastal improvements.

Demolition of the Sun Centre and improvements to the Pavilion Theatre

Proposals for the demolition of the Sun Centre and enhancements to the Pavilion Theatre remain as previously proposed.

Honey Club

Demolition of The Honey Club is now completed. The Development Agreement for the site was approved by Cabinet on 30th July and it is anticipated that the hotel should be completed and operating by autumn 2014.

The Compulsory Purchase Order for the adjacent burnt out property at 25/26 West Parade has been confirmed but there is a “cooling off” period built into the statutory process which means that it will not be possible to enter the site to complete the demolition until January 2014.

Rhyl Harbour

The bridge and enabling works contract are still progressing well, but the completion dates for each have been extended to 13th September. The delay to the enabling works contract is due to the lead in time for the concrete sections that form part of the landscaping at the entrances to the bridge; these are now being delivered to meet the programme. In respect of the bridge there have been issues with the software and there was insufficient allowance in the programme for commissioning the bridge and inducting the harbour and maritime staff into the safe operation of the bridge. All weather dependent tasks have now been completed and both decks are now working as intended. The construction risks and issues continue to be closely managed.

The Harbour Empowerment Order process will start to make progress as soon as the scoping exercise to define the extent of ‘works’ orders to be included, has been completed. DCC needs to provide technical input in inform the scoping report, but given the resource demands of the construction programme, this has not yet been completed.

New Rhyl brand and website

A designer has been appointed to develop a new Rhyl brand and website and consultations have been taking place about the proposals.

What concerns us and what are we doing about it?

Further discussions have taken place with the developers of the Ocean Plaza site about their revised proposals for progressing the scheme.

The Grange Hotel continues to be an eyesore on the seafront and no development solution has yet been identified. Costs of works to tidy the site are considerable and there is a risk that the cost of works carried out in default could not be recovered if the bank re-possess the building as they have the first charge. Proposals for a way forward were supported by the Rhyl Member Area Group and are due to be considered by the Economic Ambition Programme Board.

Although the Planning application for a cableski attraction at Marine Lake was approved and preparations underway for a July opening, the delay in achieving Planning consent has impacted on the lead in period for procurement of the system resulting in the July deadline being missed. The operator has now withdrawn plans for opening this year as the return on his investment would have been severely affected. Installation is now planned for February 2014 ready for the Easter holiday and beyond.

Outlook

Progress on the Rhyl Harbour project combined with activity on the demolition of the Honey Club is a tangible sign of our regeneration programme moving forward. There remains a considerable amount of work to do, however the prospects are positive.

What's going well?

Glan Morfa Mountain Bike Track

The additional work as mentioned in the report back in July has now been completed and 2.5 km of track has now been constructed. There is a small snagging list that we are currently working through with the contractor and which includes some surface improvements/stabilisation.

Works planned for the Autumn include:

- landscaping (quality material being provided free of charge from Anwyls)
- tree and shrub planting
- way marking of the track
- construction of a connecting route which will also act as a route for vehicles in an emergency
- the setting up of a cycling club from the local community and a yearly charge of £20 or free of charge if attending 4 half day volunteering sessions
- ensure all health and safety documentation is in place before officially opening the track.

Coastal Defence

Consultants are finalising a feasibility study to see if an affordable, lower specification, Phase 3 Coastal Defence scheme is achievable in order to fit the available budget.

Rhyl New School Project (S)

A preferred layout has been developed for the new High School project following engagement with schools and the education authority and the sketch designs were available for the community to see at consultation events at the school on 31st July and on 18th August at the Fun Day in the Botanical Gardens.

Key Milestones coming up include:

- Further consultation with partner organisations and local community groups – from October
- 'drop-in' display for DCC Members in County Hall - 10th Sept 2013 (next Council)
- DCC Rhyl Members Area Group – 11th Sept 2013

- Completion of Full business Case – February 2014
- Commencement of Site Works – Spring/Summer 2014
- Construction Programme Duration – presently estimated at 18 to 24 months

Denbighshire County Council's Cabinet recently approved a formal consultation in respect of a proposal for a new joint faith school for North Denbighshire. The formal consultation ran from 3rd June until 22nd July.

What concerns us and what are we doing about it?

The same concerns persist from the previous update report:

The need to develop a more coherent and focussed approach to making Rhyl a more attractive place to live and work was recognised at the Review in November 2012. This work will be progressed as part of a wider Denbighshire Economic Ambition Strategy.

Outlook

Rhyl currently fares poorly when compared with other North Wales locations as a place to choose to live or set up business. There are a number of reasons for this, including the poor image of the town and distance from the A55. That said, it has some significant assets which we are perhaps not making the most of, including an attractive setting with beach and easy access to countryside, along with affordable property prices. Activity and results in all the regeneration workstreams will be required to start to improve the situation, but there is also a need for the more focussed investment strategy for the town.

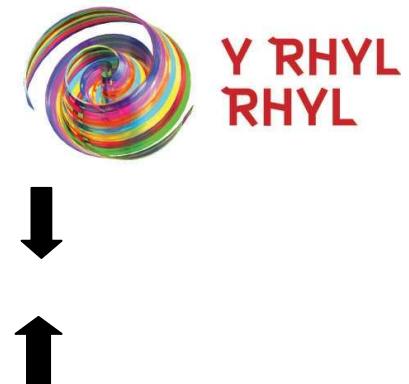
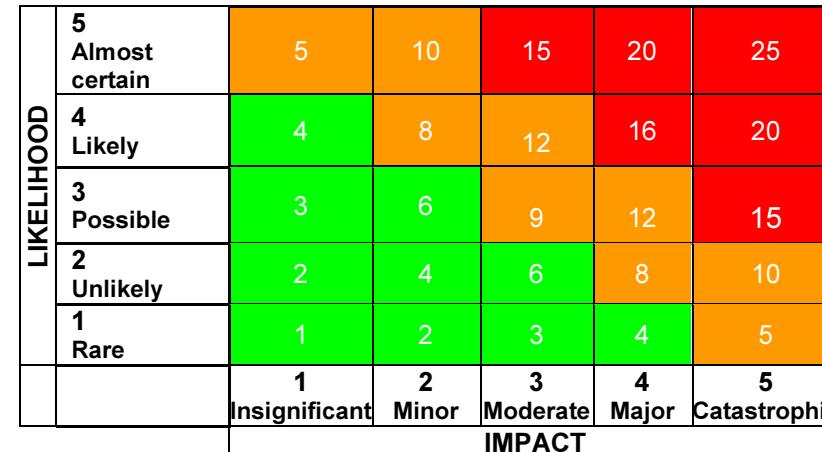

Fodd bynnag, yn amlwg mae potensial y bydd cymuned y Sipsiwn a'r Teithwyr yn cael eu trin yn llai ffafriol na grwpiau hil eraill yn Sir Ddinbych oni dderbynir a gweithredir ar ganfyddiadau'r adroddiad. Bydd Asesiad o Effaith ar Gydraddoldeb llawn yn cael ei gwblhau wrth werthuso'r opsiynau ar gyfer argymhellion a wnaed gan y grŵp llywio i'r Cyngor.

8. Datganiad y Prif Swyddog Cyllid

Nid yw'r costau ar gyfer creu meysydd preswyl a theithiol ar gael ar hyn o bryd a byddant yn amodol ar ddarparu achos busnes yn nodi goblygiadau ariannol y Cyngor ar gyfer unrhyw safleoedd fydd yn cael eu hargymhell.

9. Pa risgiau sy'n bodoli ac a oes unrhyw beth y gallwn ei wneud i'w lleihau?

Mae'r data sydd wedi'i gasglu ym mhroses "Asesiad Llety" yn rhoi gwybodaeth ar gyfer paratoi Cynlluniau Datblygu Lleol. Un o brofion i wirio cadernid drafft Cynllun Datblygu Lleol wrth ei archwilio yw a yw yn seiliedig ar dystiolaeth gadarn a chredadwy.

Pan gynhyrchedwyd CDLI Sir Ddinbych nid oedd GTANA rhanbarthol Gogledd Cymru wedi'i gwblhau; fodd bynnag roedd CDLI Sir Ddinbych wedi'i lunio mewn modd i gynnwys diweddariadau yn y dyfodol yn seiliedig ar ddata a thystiolaeth sydd ar gael. Yn awr bod y GTANA wedi'i gwblhau a bod angen safleoedd yn y Sir, gall CSDd wynebu her gyfreithiol o dan Ddeddf Cydraddoldeb oni roddir caniatâd cynllunio ar gyfer safle sy'n dderbyniol.

Mae Cyngor Sir y Fflint wedi mabwysiadu'r GTANA ac mae CBS Conwy wedi'i gyhoeddi ar ofyniad yr Arolygydd a gynhaliodd archwiliad o'u CDLI. Mae'r Cynghorau Sir sydd wedi comisiynu'r GTANA yn rhoi'r canfyddiadau drwy eu prosesau gwleidyddol perthnasol. Mae'n werth nodi hefyd bod Sir y Fflint a Wrecsam yn bwriadu estyn eu safleoedd ar gyfer 30 o garafannau a darparu safleoedd teithiol ychwanegol. Mae Cynllun Datblygu Lleol Conwy yn rhoi dyletswydd i'r Awdurdod ganfod safle addas i'w ystyried erbyn mis Mawrth 2014, tra bo Gwynedd yn darparu safle ar gyfer Teithwyr eisoes ac mae Ynys Môn yn ystyried cyflwyno papur i'r Aelodau i gael cymeradwyaeth i ddarparu safleoedd ar gyfer Sipsiwn a Theithwyr.

Felly mae risg y bydd Sir Ddinbych yn cael eu nodi fel yr unig Awdurdod Lleol nad yw wedi mabwysiadu'r GTANA all achosi archwilio/cosb bellach gan Lywodraeth Cymru a her gyfreithiol gan Gymuned y Sipsiwn a'r Teithwyr.

Petai'r Cyngor yn methu darparu safleoedd addas ar gyfer Cymuned y Sipsiwn a'r Teithwyr yna bydd nifer y gwersylloedd anghyfreithlon yn parhau ac o bosib yn gwaethyg. Mae'n werth nodi bod 24 digwyddiad o wersylloedd anghyfreithlon gan Sipsiwn a Theithwyr yn y 3 blynedd diwethaf ac mae pob Awdurdod Lleol yng Ngogledd Cymru wedi profi cynnydd mewn gwersylloedd anghyfreithlon yn y ddwy flynedd diwethaf.

Mae'n werth nodi bod un busnes lleol wedi mynegi eu pryderon yn ddiweddar i'r swyddogion ynglŷn â difrod gwersylloedd anghyfreithlon ar ddarparu cyflenwadau a mynediad i safleoedd.

Awgryma'r busnes hwn y byddent yn ystyried adleoli'r busnes i fan arall oni fyddai'r Cyngor yn delio â'r mater ac felly mae perygl y byddai effaith ar yr economi leol onid yw'r Cyngor yn darparu safleoedd yn unol ag argymhellion yr adroddiad.

**North Wales Gypsy & Traveller Accommodation Needs Assessment
2013 (Bangor University)**

Executive Summary

1.1 This summarizes the main findings and recommendations of the Gypsy and Traveller Accommodation Needs Assessment [GTANA] conducted for a consortium of five authorities in north Wales, and the Snowdonia National Park Authority. The objective of the GTANA is to assess the accommodation needs of members of the Gypsy and Traveller communities, giving them a direct voice in the process. The GTANA was managed by a Steering Group including local authority representatives, and members of the Gypsy and Traveller communities. Fieldwork also employed community members as interviewers. This Report has been written by members of the University of Bangor, on behalf of the Steering Group. Any conclusions are the responsibility of the authors alone.

1.2 The study draws of three sources of information:

- An analysis was made of existing sources of information, including research literature and other GTANA surveys identifying strengths and weaknesses of the sources available.
- Information was obtained from key stakeholders within the local authorities
- The views of the community were obtained through questionnaires, focus groups and discussions. A total of 93 responses from adult Gypsies and Travellers, and a further 43 from a survey of young Gypsies and Travellers, from a range of tenures and community groups, were received. The community questionnaire invited respondents to identify their aspirations for sites and their preferred location.

Background

1.3 Since 2006, the Welsh Government has encouraged local strategic housing authorities to collaborate in producing Local Housing Market Area assessments of the future level and nature of housing demand. The LHMA process feeds into the production of Local Development Plans. An essential part of the LHMA process is the production of a Gypsy and Traveller Accommodation Needs

Assessment. For this GTANA, the counties of Conwy, Denbighshire, Flintshire, Gwynedd and Ynys Môn joined together to conduct the GTANA, in collaboration with Bangor University. The Study was managed and commissioned by a steering group consisting of representatives of the local authorities [and SNPA], members of the Gypsy and Traveller community and the University of Bangor.

1.4 The broader objectives of the study are:

- To produce, in consultation with local Gypsies and Travellers, detailed information about in relation to their demographic profile, household formation, current accommodation needs, accommodation related service and support needs and barriers to accessing services.
- To generate reliable estimates of future accommodation need.
- To assess the current and potential future needs within the Gypsy and Traveller communities in the North West Wales Housing Market Area & Flintshire, i.e. the Study Area, for learning, health services and other services provided by local authorities and their partner organisations.
- To assess the relevance of the policies and strategies in relation to Gypsies and Travellers used by the Partner authorities.

Main Findings

Local Gypsies and Travellers

1.5 Very little information is available on the numbers of Gypsies and Travellers in the UK as a whole, in Wales, or in the study area. Estimates for the UK as a whole vary from 82,000 to 300,000, including those living in Bricks and Mortar housing. It is agreed that in Wales most Gypsies and Travellers are concentrated along the key transport routes in the North and South of Wales. In the study area, there are currently 78 authorized pitches, and a further four caravans on unauthorized developments. Ten vehicles occupied by New Travellers are situated on an unauthorized but tolerated encampment on Ynys Môn. It is estimated that between half and two-thirds of the Gypsy and Traveller population of the UK now live in 'bricks and mortar' housing, either through choice, but may also be through necessity, due to the shortage of pitches on authorized sites. There is no reliable estimate of the total numbers of Gypsies and Travellers living in bricks and mortar in the study area, but from the survey it is clear the number is significant, and distributed between the local authorities. They occupied both private and socially rented accommodation, and owner occupiers.

Characteristics of local Gypsies and Travellers

- 1.6 24 per cent identified as Romany Gypsy, 58 per cent as Travellers, of whom 34 per cent were Irish Travellers, 17 per cent as New Travellers, and 1 per cent as Travelling Showman.
- 1.7 Mean household size was 4.37 persons, median size was four persons. Younger families predominated. The survey did not contact any persons aged 65 or over.
- 1.8 Most respondents described themselves as local to the area.

Gypsies and Travellers and local services

- 1.9 The survey questioned Gypsies and Travellers about their use of local services and their views on the services provided. The Traveller Education Service Some accounts of perceived discriminatory behaviour by local services, health and welfare agencies, and police and local authorities were reported, but other respondents were considered they were treated 'as other people' The Traveller Education Service was generally praised, and the availability of dedicated liaison staff such as the GTLO welcomed.

Accommodation preferences and aspirations

- 1.10 Respondents were asked for their views on the location and nature of further permanent site provision. It should be noted Gypsies and Travellers who want to develop sites privately are face significant obstacles in obtaining planning permission, though more permissions are obtained through the planning and legal appeal processes.

Accommodation need and supply

- 1.11 Using standard calculations, a shortfall of 62 pitches was identified by the year 2016. It should be noted that while the calculations to 2016 are presented on a local authority basis, this is not to imply that future provision should automatically be confined within the boundaries currently existing. Both the WAG guidance (WAG, 2006) and current policy proposals (WG, 2011) support the view that collaborative approaches to these issues are to be preferred.

1.12 After 2016, assuming all current need has been addressed; the base calculation is that the number of pitches required will continue to increase at 3 per cent per annum compound. This would produce an overall requirement of 167 pitches (rounded up to nearest whole number) by 2021, an increase of 25 on the 2016 figure, and 194 pitches, a further increase of 27 (both estimates by 2026. Other factors might increase this requirement.

Unauthorized encampments and transit requirements

1.13 Currently, there is no transit site located within the study area. Part of the Gypsy and Traveller site at Llandegai in Gwynedd was previously used as a transit site, but this was discontinued in 2005, following significant management issues relating directly to this part of the site. The discussion of transit site need derives its evidence from local authority data, on unauthorized encampments in the GTANA area during the years 2009 and 2010, together with an input of stakeholder experience.

1.14 Addressing unauthorized encampments can lead to considerable outlay, by both public authorities and the private sector, and may have a significant impact on relationships between the settled community and the Gypsy and Traveller community

1.15 This calculation of the transit site requirement is based on assumptions set out below. These are:

- Annually, about 55 encampments occur in the study area
- 10% of temporary encampments, about six during the year, will be from those looking for permanent site accommodation, and are discussed under the permanent site requirement
- Thus 90% of encampments, about 49 in total, would require transit accommodation
- The maximum stay would be for one month, though some encampments would be for a shorter period
- Accommodation for 7 caravans would deal with most encampments.

1.16 Using 7 as a working figure, transit requirements would be for (49 multiplied by 7) caravans per annum, or 343 over the year. On a monthly basis, this amounts to 28.5 caravans. However, for reasons discussed, this can involve some element of double counting. Proportionately, about 47% of encampments are recorded in the Gwynedd and Ynys Môn area, 15% in the central area of Conwy and Denbighshire, and 37% in Flintshire.

1.17 It is therefore suggested that the authorities work together to consider three or four transit sites accommodating up to seven caravans. More than one site is to be preferred, for a number of reasons

- They are more likely to be used if close to traditional stopping places
- The size of each site would be reduced
- Difficulties about ethnic or inter-family tensions would be reduced.
- A single transit site for the area would not resolve the issues. It is important that there is somewhere for occupants to move on, and a network is required. The local authorities should work jointly to identify appropriate sites for temporary accommodation on a regional basis.

1.18 It is recommended that the local authorities work jointly to identify appropriate sites for temporary accommodation. These may be transit sites, with a

relatively full range of facilities where stays of up to three months may be permitted, or temporary stopping places with more restricted provision, where stays may be limited to 28 days. The nature, as well as the location, of provision, should be informed by data on the patterns of unauthorized encampment in recent years

1.19 There are a number of recommendations for action:

- 1.20 *Recommendation 1:* Following the guidance from the Welsh Government on adopting a collaborative approach, a North West Wales Gypsy and Traveller Co-ordination Group comprising of representatives from local authorities and sub-regional partners should be formed to continue the development of a meaningful and co-ordinated approach to Gypsy and Traveller accommodation and related issues, as well as ensuring that the findings from the GTANA are disseminated to departments within the partner Authorities and other stakeholder. The existing Gypsy Traveller Working Group would provide an excellent foundation for such a group, along with representation from the Gypsy and Traveller community.
- 1.21 *Recommendation 2:* A North West Wales Gypsy and Traveller Representative Group, with as wide a geographical representation as possible, should be established representing the views of the local Gypsy and Traveller population, and contribute to the consultative process. A Chair and administrative support for the group should be provided from the North West Wales Gypsy and Traveller Co-ordination Group.
- 1.22 *Recommendation 3:* All partner authorities should ensure that an internal working group exists within each authority. This group should cut across service areas, in order to better co-ordinate the response and approach on Gypsy and Traveller issues and avoid potential duplication of work.
- 1.23 *Recommendation 4:* Each authority should identify a lead officer who manages each authority's response to Gypsies and Traveller issues.
- 1.24 *Recommendation 5:* In order to adhere to Equalities legislation, and to ensure the high quality of on-going monitoring, local authorities should ensure that Gypsies and Travellers are recognised in ethnic monitoring forms, most urgently in relation to housing and planning
- 1.25 *Recommendation 6:* Local authorities should ensure that principles of equality, in relation to Gypsies and Travellers, are embedded in the wide range of services provided. In particular this includes: housing, planning and homelessness polices.

- 1.26 *Recommendation 7:* Local authorities should be sensitive to the different cultural and support needs of Gypsies and Travellers who may present as homeless and those who may require local authority accommodation.
- 1.27 *Recommendation 8:* Residential site waiting lists should be: accessible to all Gypsies and Travellers in the area, and clear and transparent in terms of allocation policies
- 1.28 *Recommendation 9:* The management of permanent sites needs to be evaluated at regular intervals in accordance with the guidance issued by the Welsh Assembly Government (WAG, 2008)
- 1.29 *Recommendation 10:* Social Housing Agencies to establish if any such pattern results from positive choices, or negative decisions due to perceived threats or other causes.
- 1.30 *Recommendation 11:* The methods and approaches used by local authorities in promoting affordable accommodation to members of the non-Traveller communities should be adapted to the accommodation used by members of Gypsy and Traveller communities.
- 1.31 *Recommendation 12:* A progressive campaign which would promote the lifestyle and culture of Gypsies and Travellers in a positive light may help alleviate some of the racial discrimination experienced by young and older Gypsy and Travellers across the study area.
- 1.32 *Recommendation 13:* Ensure that staff working in primary and secondary schools have sufficient training about Gypsy and Traveller culture in order to tackle bullying more effectively.
- 1.33 *Recommendation 14:* Local Authorities should consider collectively providing the resources to recruit and train outreach workers (possibly from Gypsy and Traveller communities) to engage with young people.
- 1.34 *Recommendation 15:* Further research is needed with Travelling Show people, in conjunction with the Showmen's Guild, before recommendations can be made
- 1.35 *Recommendation 16:* An aspiration of many members of the Gypsy and Traveller community is to be owner-occupiers, as such there is a need to develop a constructive dialogue between Gypsies and Travellers seeking to develop private sites and planning authorities.
- 1.36 *Recommendation 17:* Planning departments should offer appropriate advice and support to Gypsies and Travellers on the workings of the planning system

and the criteria to be considered in applications. This advice may require some tailoring for this particular client group.

- 1.37 *Recommendation 18*: All issues relating to access to services issues need to be disseminated as widely as possible by the North West Wales Gypsy and Traveller Co-ordination Group in consultation with the North West Wales Gypsy and Traveller Representative Group resulting in a strategy on how to improve the experiences of the local Gypsy and Traveller community as well as a facility to report other examples.
- 1.38 *Recommendation 19*: Local authorities should seek to identify possible sites where permission for a residential site might be granted.
- 1.39 *Recommendation 20*: that all counties complete the biannual caravan count.
- 1.40 *Recommendation 21*: that a common protocol for reporting the presence of unauthorised encampments and addressing the issues is agreed by the local authorities.
- 1.41 *Recommendation 22*: All authorities within the study area, or whatever group continues the GTANA process, should decide on a common format for the recording of encampments. Ideally this should contain at least the following items:
 - Date encampment was reported
 - Date encampment ended
 - Location, nature of site [public/private; industrial or business park, retail car park, other]
 - Number of caravans,
 - Estimated number of adults and children.
- 1.42 *Recommendation 23*: It is also recommended that data from North Wales Police be included, to aid consistency and completeness.
- 1.43 *Recommendation 24*: It is recommended that the local authorities work jointly to identify appropriate sites for temporary accommodation. These may be transit sites, with a relatively full range of facilities where stays of up to three months may be permitted, or temporary stopping places with more restricted provision, where stays may be limited to 28 days. The nature, as well as the location, of provision, should be informed by data on the patterns of unauthorised encampment in recent years. That stated, analysis of the existing data indicates different patterns between the local authorities in the consortium.

Appendix 2

Gypsy and Traveller Accommodation Working Group

Introduction

The North Wales Gypsy and Traveller Accommodation Needs Assessment (GTANA) has identified unmet need for residential sites in Denbighshire and transit sites across the region; the recommendation for the latter being that this need be met by cross County collaboration.

It is proposed Denbighshire County Council, in accordance with GTANA recommendation, establish an internal working group to better co-ordinate the response and approach on Gypsy and Traveller issues and avoid potential duplication of work.

Purpose

The purpose of establishing a Denbighshire Gypsy and Traveller Working Group is;

- To ensure the Council meets its full legal obligations in addressing the needs of Gypsies and Travellers
- To look at how the accommodation needs of Gypsies and Travellers can best be met within the County.
- To consider the potential impact of establishing accommodation (site provision) on the Council's resources, local communities and the local economy and how this can be most effectively managed through a fully coordinated approach.
- To determine how unmet accommodation need be met by consideration of a range of options including site provision owned and managed by Gypsies and / or Travellers; or owned and managed by the Council; or owned by the Council but managed by an appointed agent, or owned and managed by an RSL.

Membership

It is recommended that the Group be lead by Housing Services (Care and Support Manager) with a broad based membership to facilitate a fully coordinated approach. The following represents the core membership of the group who could invite on other stakeholders or advisors as deemed appropriate;

- Lead Member for Housing
- Homelessness Champion

- Legal Services representative
- Planning Services representative
- Homelessness and Housing Options Officer
- Education Services representative
- Countryside services representative
- Supporting People representative

It is proposed that any recommendations from the steering group are reported back to full council for consideration.

4. Manylion am yr Adroddiad.

Mae Cefnogi Pobl (CP) yn rhaglen bwysig sy'n rhoi gwasanaethau cefnogi yn ymwneud â thai i ystod eang o bobl ddiamddiffyn, gan gynnwys; pobl ifanc, pobl hŷn, pobl sy'n dianc rhag trais domestig, pobl ddigartref, pobl sydd ag anghenion iechyd meddwl, pobl ag anableddau dysgu, pobl gydag anghenion camddefnyddio sylweddu, cyn-droseddwyr ac eraill. Yn Sir Ddinbych, mae Cefnogi Pobl yn ariannu ystod eang o wasanaethau gan gynnwys; elfennau o dai gwarchod, gofal ychwanegol, llochesau merched, cynlluniau byw yn y gymuned ar gyfer pobl gydag anableddau dysgu a chynlluniau ar gyfer pobl digartref.

Nod cefnogaeth yn ymwneud â thai yw galluogi pobl i gadw eu daliadaeth tai, sy'n aml yn denantiaeth, trwy ddatblygu a chynnal yr hyder a'r sgiliau i fyw mor annibynnol â phosibl. Mae'r Rhaglen Cefnogi Pobl wedi'i gwerthuso ar lefel genedlaethol ac wedi cyflawni buddion ariannol a buddion eraill cadarnhaol iawn.

Y sefyllfa bresennol

Gweithredwyd newidiadau i weinyddiaeth y rhaglen CP yn 2012. Roedd y rhain yn cynnwys; canllawiau newydd a llywodraethu, trefniadau cytundebol newydd a fformwla dosbarthu cyllid newydd.

Mae'r fformwla dosbarthu cyllid wedi lleihau cyllideb Cefnogi Pobl Sir Ddinbych 5% bob blwyddyn rhwng 2012-2013 a 2016-17. Sefydlwyd cynlluniau i reoli'r toriadau hyn heb gael effaith sylwedol ar lefelau gwasanaeth yn 2012-13, 2013-14 a 2014-15 a hefyd i ddatblygu ac ymgynghori ar fframwaith blaenoriaethu strategol eglur i roi gwybod i reolwyr am y toriadau yn 2015-16 a 2016-17.

Ym mis Gorffennaf cawsom wybod gan Lywodraeth Cymru y dylem ddisgwyl toriadau pellach o fis Ebrill 2014. Ymgynghorwyd â ni ynglŷn â'r dewisiadau ar gyfer rheoli'r toriadau hyn, ac o'r broses hon rydym yn deall y bydd y cyfanswm toriadau yn 2014-15 yn tua 12% - er nad yw hyn wedi'i gadarnhau gan Lywodraeth Cymru.

Mae'r Cynllun Comisiynu Lleol (CCLI) felly wedi canolbwyntio ar reoli'r gostyngiadau y gwyddwn amdanynt ac maent hefyd mewn sefyllfa i ymateb i doriadau cyllideb ychwanegol mewn modd sy'n lleihau'r effaith ar ddefnyddwyr gwasanaeth.

Rydym wedi mabwysiadu agwedd gymsg a hyblyg. Ar gyfer cynllunio cyllideb 2014/15, mae hyn wedi cynnwys rhoi'r gorau i broiectau sydd heb eu comisiynu, digomisiynu rhai proiectau gyda chaniatâd y darparwyr ac yn olaf, trafod cytundebau gostyngedig ar gyfer proiectau oedd heb eu meddiannu yn llawn neu'n cael anhawster cynnal darpariaeth gwasanaeth.

Yn 2015/16 bydd yr heriau yn galetach. Eto, rydym yn ceisio lleihau'r effaith ar ddefnyddwyr gwasanaeth os yw'n bosibl trwy drafod arbedion effeithlonrwydd ac ailffurfweddu gyda darparwyr gwasanaeth unigol. Mae'r canllawiau Grant Rhaglen Cefnogi Pobl yn ei gwneud yn ofynnol i ni adolygu pob proiect cyn eu hailfodelu; felly mae'n anodd gwneud ymrwymiadau terfynol cyn i adolygiadau gael eu cwblhau.

Efallai na allwn gyflawni'r holl arbedion rydym eu hangen yn y modd hwn ac ar gyfer 2014/15 efallai y bydd rhaid i ni hefyd leihau'r holl gytundebau lle nad yw arbedion wedi'u trafod/canfod cymaint â 10%. Ond, rydym yn ceisio cyflawni arbedion trwy gonsensws ac rydym eisoes wedi trafod 75% o'r raddfa arbedion disgwyliedig ar gyfer 14/15 yn y modd hwn. Wrth hyrwyddo agwedd strategol at ganfod effeithlonrwydd, mae Llywodraeth Cymru yn gofyn am ymgysylltiad adeiladol gan ddarparwyr i gyflawni arbedion yn 14/15, ac mae hyn yn ddefnyddiol.

Rydym wedi ymrwymo i gymryd agwedd strategol i'r dewisiadau anodd rydym yn eu hwynebu, a gall gynnwys digomisiynu gwasanaethau. I'r perwyl hwn, rydym yn parhau i ddatblygu ein fframwaith Blaenoriaeth Strategol i Ariannu (SPTF).

Goblygiadau ar gyfer Sir Ddinbych

Mae toriad o 12% yn 2014-15 a 5% yn 2015-16 a 2016-17 yn cynrychioli colled sylwedol o arian gydag effeithiau yn debygol ar wasanaethau CP sy'n cael eu darparu yn fewnol gan y Cyngor, gan gynnwys; y Gwasanaethau Tai, Gwasanaethau Oedolion a Busnes a'r Gwasanaethau Plant a Theuluoedd.

Camau gweithredu a restrwyd yn y CCLI CP ar gyfer 2014-15 a 2015-16

Mae manylion y camau gweithredu wedi'u cynnwys yn Atodiad 1 yr adroddiad hwn. Y prif flaenoriaethau strategol a nodwyd yw:

- Merched a Dynion sy'n dioddef cam-drin domestig**

Mae'r holl wasanaethau cam-drin domestig (sy'n cael eu darparu ar hyn o bryd gan Gymorth i Ferched Glyndŵr, Hafan Cymru a Gwasanaethau Cam-drin Domestig Gogledd Sir Ddinbych) yn cael eu hadolygu yn 2013 gyda'r bwriad o'u hailfodelu. Rhagwelir y bydd y gwasanaethau sydd wedi'u hailfodelu yn cynnwys arbedion ariannol. Y bwriad yw ailfodelu'r gwasanaethau mewn dau gam, gan ganolbwytio ar Gefnogaeth yn ôl yr angen a Tai gyda Chefnogaeth yn 2014/15.

- **Pobl gydag Anableddau Dysgu**

Fel y nodwyd yn yr adroddiad Craffu dyddiedig 24/06/13, bydd Gwasanaethau Oedolion Cyngor Sir Ddinbych yn lleihau'r arian cyffredinol i adlewyrchu toriadau grantiau cyffredinol.

- **Pobl Ifanc gydag Anghenion Cefnogi (16 - 24)**

Bydd Prosiect Tai gyda Chefnogaeth 24 awr Pobl Ifanc Dinbych yn dechrau yn fuan yn 2014 – gyda chyswllt posibl â'r prosiect cefnogaeth yn ôl yr angen pobl ifanc Tai Clwyd 5 YP.

- **Cyffredinol/Cefnogaeth yn ôl yr angen/Peripatetig (gwasanaethau cefnogi tenantiaeth sy'n ymwneud ag ystod o anghenion defnyddwyr)**

Ystyried ailfodelu'r gwasanaethau Ailgyfanheddu a Lloches Nos Nacro y Rhyl i ddarparu gwasanaeth mwy hyblyg ac ymatebol ar gyfer unigolion sy'n cysgu ar y strydoedd, efallai fel prosiect ar y cyd a all gynnwys budd-ddeiliaid eraill a chomisiynu trawsffiniol rhai elfennau.

Cynllun Gwario CP

Oherwydd yr ansicrwydd ynglŷn â thoriadau, nid yw wedi bod yn bosibl eto i gynhyrchu Cynllun Gwario CP terfynol. Daw hwn i ben pan fydd y gwir lefel ariannu wedi'i gadarnhau. Mae crynodebau'r cyfrifiadau grant a'r effaith lleihad gwario a ragwelir ar gyfer 2014-15 wedi'u dangos yn y tabl yn Atodiad 2. Mae Atodiad 2 wedi'i eithrio o gael ei ddatgelu yn gyhoeddus ar hyn o bryd yn rhinwedd paragraff 14, Rhan 4, Atodlen 12A Deddf Llywodraeth Leol 1972.

Mae'r lleihad arfaethedig o 12.4% yn 2014/15 (£800k) a'r lleihad pellach tybiedig o 5% yn 2015/16 (£283k) gyfystyr â tua £1,083m. Mae hyn yn ychwanegol at y £549k sydd eisoes wedi'i reoli a'i gynnwys hyd at ac yn cynnwys 2013/14. Oherwydd bod graddfa'r toriadau i'w cadarnhau ar gyfer 2014/15, nid yw'n bosibl darparu cynllun gwariant terfynol ar gyfer y ddwy flynedd ar hyn o bryd, er bod cynlluniau arian at raid wedi'u sefydlu.

Mae'r canllawiau CP yn gofyn am gyflwyno gwariant 3 blynedd. Ond, nid ydym mewn sefyllfa i gynllunio mor bell â hyn ymlaen nes y cawn beth sicrwydd ynglŷn â'r lefelau ariannu tebygol.

Mae pob prosiect yn destun proses adolygu. Wrth i hyn ddatblygu, gall yr adolygiadau helpu i ategu dewisiadau eraill i gyflawni'r lefel arbedion gofynnol. Bydd pob adolygiad yn ystyried; cymhwysedd gwasanaethau, perthnasedd strategol a pherfformiad yn erbyn cytundebau a chanlyniadau.

5. Sut mae'r penderfyniad yn cyfrannu at y Blaenoriaethau Corfforaethol?

Bydd cydweithio rhanbarthol a strategaeth rhanbarthol ar gyfer comisiynu a darparu gwasanaethau yn cyfrannu at reoli'r lleihad mewn grant a diogelu gwasanaethau rheng flaen ar gyfer grwpiau diamdiffyn, sy'n bwysig mewn perthynas â blaenoriaethau corfforaethol.

6. Beth fydd yn ei gostio a sut y bydd yn effeithio ar wasanaethau eraill?

Yn unol â'r gohebiaeth flaenorol gan Lywodraeth Cymru, y cyfanswm lleihad hysbys mewn grant CP yw tua £1.469m ar gyfer Sir Ddinbych (sy'n seiliedig ar y 23% dros 5 mlynedd 2012 - 2016/17). Bydd hyn yn cael effaith ar y cyllidebau Gofal Cymdeithasol a Thai. Yr effaith gyffredinol ar y gyllideb CP fydd £323,000 yn 2014-15 a £306,000 yn 2015-16.

Yn ogystal â'r toriadau hysbys, rhagwelir y bydd toriad ychwanegol o cymaint â 7% o'r gyllideb 2014/15. Bydd hyn yn cael effaith ar y cyllidebau Gofal Cymdeithasol a Thai. Gall yr arbedion ychwanegol gofynnol fod tua £477,000.

Bydd y prosiectau a'r newidiadau a nodwyd yn cael eu rheoli o fewn y gyllideb Cefnogi Pobl a ddyrannwyd i Sir Ddinbych gan Lywodraeth Cymru.

7. Pa ymgynghoriadau a gynhaliwyd?

Cynhaliodd y Grŵp Cynllunio Cefnogi Pobl dri cyfarfod yn ystod cyfnod datblygu'r adroddiad hwn ac ystyriodd y data Mapio Anghenion (NM), gwybodaeth map cyflenwad ac adborth gan fudd-ddeiliaid a chyfarfodydd ymgynghori. Aethpwyd i dri cyfarfod gyda defnyddwyr gwasanaeth a deg cyfarfod arall gyda darparwyr unigol. Cyflwynwyd y cynllun drafft hefyd i'r fforwm darparwyr ym mis Awst.

Cynhaliwyd proses ymgynghori wyth wythnos oedd yn cynnwys y darparwyr cefnogaeth bresennol a'r defnyddwyr gwasanaeth a budd-ddeiliaid eraill rhwng Gorffennaf a Medi. Rhoddwyd gwybod i'r Grŵp Cynllunio CP am farn, sylwadau ac awgrymiadau o'r broses i ategu datblygiad y cynllun hwn, ac maent wedi'u crynhoi isod.

Cyflwynwyd y ddogfen derfynol i Grŵp Cynllunio Cefnogi Pobl Sir Ddinbych ar 17 Medi 2013 a bydd yn cael ei gyflwyno i Gabinet y Cyngor i gael cymeradwyaeth ar 26 Tachwedd 2013.

Bydd y ddogfen yn cael ei chyflwyno i gael ystyriaeth Pwyllgor Cydweithredol Rhanbarthol Cefnogi Pobl Gogledd Cymru ym mis Ionawr 2014, i ategu datblygiad Cynllun Comisiynu Rhanbarthol Gogledd Cymru. Yn olaf, bydd y Cynllun yn cael ei basio i Adran y Gweinidog Tai ac Adfywio yn Llywodraeth Cymru.

Bydd y ddogfen derfynol yn cael ei chyhoeddi ar dudalennau Cefnogi Pobl gwefan Cyngor Sir Ddinbych ac yn cael ei dosbarthu i'r holl grwpiau cynllunio a fforymau presennol sy'n gysylltiedig â Chefnogi Pobl yn Sir Ddinbych.

8. Datganiad y Prif Swyddog Cyllid

Mae'n rhaid parhau i reoli goblygiadau'r cyfyngiadau ariannu ar y rhaglen Cefnogi Pobl yn ofalus, yn ogystal â'r effaith ehangach ar gyllidebau gofal cymdeithasol a thai. Mae'r cyngor wedi bod yn ddarbodus a gwneud peth darpariaeth ariannol i leihau effaith y cyfyngiadau ariannu os oes angen. Ond, bydd rhaid parhau i adolygu'r rhaglen a'r gwasanaethau y bydd yn ei ariannu i sicrhau bod gwariant yn aros o fewn y gyllideb a ddyrannwyd.

9. Pa risgiau sy'n bodoli ac a oes unrhyw beth y gallwn ei wneud i'w lleihau?

Mae'r cynigion i reoli'r lleihad mewn arian grant yn 2014-15 yn rhesymol. Gellir talu am unrhyw ddiffyg mewn cyllidebau gofal cymdeithasol mewn blwyddyn o'r gronfa a sefydlwyd i reoli'r toriadau grantiau cynlluniedig. Mae'r cynnig i ddosbarthu'r lleihad grant yn gyfartal

yn y gwasanaethau CP yn rhannu'r effaith yn fwy cytbwys ond mae'n cynnwys risg yng nghyd-destun pwylgor rhanbarthol gyda barn wahanol ynglŷn â blaenoriaethau gyda'r arian CP cyffredinol. Mae dosbarthiad toriadau mwy cytbwys yn golygu bod yr effaith ar y Cyngor yn gyffredinol yn cael ei reoli yn well ac y bydd yn rhoi mwy o hyblygrwydd i ddefnyddio'r gronfa CP i ymdrin â'r mater.
