Cyflwynodd yr Aelod Arweiniol ar gyfer Tir y Cyhoedd, y Cynghorydd David Smith, yr adroddiad gorfodaeth parcio (a gylchredwyd yn flaenorol) i Aelodau ei ystyried ac archwilio Strategaeth Gorfodaeth Parcio'r Cyngor a'i effaith ar ddatblygiad economaidd.

Ysgrifennwyd Polisi Parcio'r Cyngor ym 1996. Cafodd gorfodaeth parcio ei ddaddroseddoli yn Sir Ddinbych yn 2004. Cyn 2004, yr Heddlu a gynhaliodd y dasg o orfodi.

Mae Cyngor Sir Ddinbych yn cyflogi 7 Swyddog Gorfodi Sifil llawn amser a 2 staff wrth gefn, 2 aelod o staff llawn amser i gasglu arian o'r peiriannau Talu ac Arddangos peiriannau ac un gweithiwr rhan-amser i gyfrif a phrosesu'r holl arian a gasglwyd.

Mae'r dirwyon a roddwyd gan Swyddogion Gorfodi Sifil yn cael eu galw'n Rhybuddion Talu Cosb (RhTC).

Cynhelir adolygiad o'r tîm Gorfodaeth Parcio fel rhan o'r ymarfer ailstrwythuro ehangach a oedd wedi bod yn mynd rhagddo yn y Gwasanaethau Priffyrdd ac Amgylchedd.

Trafodwyd y canlynol yn ystod y drafodaeth:

- Roedd yna fwriad yn y dyfodol i gyflwyno camerâu corff i'w gwisgo gan Swyddogion Gorfodi Sifil ar gyfer lles diogelwch ond hefyd i helpu i ddarparu tystiolaeth hollbwysig mewn achosion lle honnir bod y Swyddog Gorfodi Sifil wedi bod yn anghwrtais neu'n ddigywilydd.
- Roedd Grŵp Ardal Aelodau Rhuthun wedi defnyddio dyraniadau ariannol ei aelodau i ychwanegu at y costau parcio yn Rhuthun i gadw cost parcio'n isel.
- Gofynnwyd am arwyddion yn cyfeirio pobl i feysydd parcio "arhosiad hir" neu "arhosiad byr".
- Roedd Network Rail/Arriva yn edrych ar ddyfeisio mecanwaith ar gyfer maes parcio'r orsaf reilffordd ym Mhrestatyn a fyddai'n galluogi defnyddwyr trên i barcio am ddim ac eraill sy'n defnyddio'r maes parcio i dalu ac arddangos.
- Cynhelir adolygiad o bolisi parcio a pharcio yn gyffredinol ac astudiaeth i gael ei chynnal i sicrhau bod polisi prisio meysydd parcio yn ddigonol i annog twf economaidd lleol.

PENDERFYNWYD:

- (i) Pwyllgor Archwilio Cymunedau i gefnogi'r gwaith datblygu Polisi Parcio newydd ar y cyd rhwng Priffyrdd a Datblygiad Economaidd a Busnes, a bod adolygiad o'r polisi yn cynnwys archwilio darparu arwyddion parcio clir a phriodol ar draws y sir.

6 STRATEGAETH ATAL BAW CŴN

Cyflwynodd yr Aelod Arweiniol ar gyfer Tir y Cyhoedd, y Cynghorydd David Smith yr adroddiad ar y Strategaeth Atal Baeddu (a gylchredwyd yn flaenorol) i alluogi'r Aelodau i adolygu cynnydd yr ymgyrch hyd yma a chynlluniau dros y misoedd nesaf.

Roedd y cynllun wedi'i greu tua 9 mis yn ôl gyda'r bwriad o godi ymwybyddiaeth o gŵn yn baeddu yn Sir Ddinbych a hefyd i annog pobl i lanhau ar ôl eu cŵn.

Rhoddodd y Swyddog Twristiaeth, Marchnata a Digwyddiadau - Arfordir, ddiweddariad i'r aelodau ynglŷn ag effaith monitro'r ymgyrch hyd yma.

Cafwyd trafodaeth ar y materion a ganlyn:

- Roedd siroedd cyfagos, gan gynnwys Cynghorau Cymuned yng Nghonwy wedi cysylltu â'r Cyngor, a ofynnodd am ddefnyddio delwedd yr ymgyrch gan ei fod yn profi i fod yn fwy effeithiol na'r un oedd yn cael ei ddefnyddio ar hyn o bryd. Roedd Cyngor Sir y Fflint hefyd wedi gwneud ymholiadau ynghylch yr arwyddion polyn lamp gan eu bod yn bwriadu defnyddio'r un fformat ar gyfer eu hymgyrch. Roedd y defnydd o arwyddion wedi bod yn llwyddiant mawr a defnyddir mewn llawer o leoedd i atgyfnerthu'r atal a lleihau achosion baeddu.
- Roedd rhaglen addysg wedi cael ei sefydlu. Byddai hyn yn cael ei gyflwyno gan y Gwasanaethau leuenctid. Ymwelir ag ysgolion i ddangos enghreifftiau o'r deunydd hyrwyddo a gemau rhyngweithiol ac ati ar gyfer disgyblion i fynd adref.
- Roedd angen ystyried hirhoedledd yr ymgyrch a'r adnoddau sydd ar gael i gefnogi cyflwyno hyn. Roedd y prif gostau parhaus yn cynnwys disodli deunydd hyrwyddo a'r rhif ffôn 0800.
- Yn dilyn buddsoddiad dros y ddwy flynedd ddiwethaf, mae gan y Cyngor bellach bron 1000 o finiau sbwriel ar draws y sir, ac maent i gyd yn derbyn gwastraff cŵn mewn bagiau. Roedd y biniau hyn hefyd yn ychwanegol at y biniau cŵn a osodwyd mewn ardaloedd twristiaeth. Roedd pob bin newydd yn cynnwys arwyddion yn dangos eu bod yn cymryd gwastraff cŵn ac roedd arwyddion/sticeri tebyg yn cael eu rhoi ar hen finiau. Archebwyd 120 o finiau ers i'r ymgyrch ddechrau.
- Codwyd y pwynt bod angen annog pobl i roi gwybod am ddigwyddiadau fel arall ni ellir dileu'r broblem.
- Cafwyd cais a gyflwynwyd gan y Cynghorydd Peter Evans i Gallt Melyd gael eu rhestru ar wahân o fewn dogfennaeth y dyfodol a dim eu cynnwys o fewn Prestatyn, yn enwedig gan y bu problem fawr gyda baw cŵn ar hyd y llwybr o Brestatyn i Ddyserth.

Cyflwynodd yr Aelod Arweiniol ar gyfer Tir y Cyhoedd, y Cynghorydd David Smith, y Strategaeth Rheoli Llifogydd Drafft (a gylchlythyrwyd yn flaenorol) i'r aelodau ystyried fersiwn drafft terfynol y Strategaeth cyn yr ymgynghoriad cyhoeddus.

Dywedodd yr Uwch Beiriannydd, Rheoli Risg Llifogydd (SE: FRM) bod y Ddeddf Rheoli Llifogydd a Dŵr yn ei gwneud yn ofynnol i'r Cyngor, fel Awdurdod Llifogydd Lleol Arweiniol i ddatblygu, cynnal, cymhwyso a monitro Strategaeth Rheoli Risg Llifogydd Lleol. Yn 2011 cyhoeddodd Llywodraeth Cymru ganllawiau i Awdurdodau Cymru a oedd yn awgrymu bod Strategaethau Rheoli Risg Llifogydd Lleol yn eu lle erbyn 31 Mawrth 2013. Roedd y Cyngor wedi bod ar y trywydd iawn i gyrraedd y targed hyd nes y llifogydd mawr ym mis Tachwedd 2012. Roedd Llywodraeth Cymru wedi cytuno i gais y Cyngor ei fod yn gohirio cwblhau ei Strategaeth hyd nes yr adroddir i Lywodraeth Cymru am gasgliad yr ymchwiliad llifogydd.

Dywedodd SE:FRM ar y camau a oedd wedi digwydd ers y llifogydd ym mis Tachwedd 2012 a chytunodd i hysbysu aelodau am waith arfaethedig a'r gwaith a wneir o fewn eu wardiau. Roedd y ddogfen Strategaeth ddrafft wedi cael ei hanfon at yr holl aelodau, ond, gan ei bod wedi bod yn ddogfen mor sylweddol, cadarnhaodd SE:FRM bod aelodau yn e-bostio eu sylwadau ar y Strategaeth iddo erbyn 9 Rhagfyr 2013. Yna, byddai'r adborth a dderbyniwyd yn cael ei anfon i NRW.

Yn dilyn trafodaeth ddwys cytunodd yr SE:FRM:

- I edrych ar gynnydd NRW gyda'r gwaith modelu hydrolig a oedd yn rhan o'r astudiaeth ddichonoldeb i atebion peirianyddol posibl i leihau'r risg o lifogydd yn Brwcws.
- I holi am y sefyllfa ddiweddaraf o ran disodli'r cylfat yn Llanbedr DC.
- I ddod o hyd i restr gynhwysfawr o'r holl eiddo ar hyd Ffordd Isaf Dinbych yn Llanelwy a fydd yn cael eu rhybuddio yn y dyfodol gan Wasanaeth Rhybudd Llifogydd NRW ar gyfer cynghorwyr sir lleol.
- Er mwyn sicrhau bod aelodau lleol yn cael gwybod am waith lliniaru llifogydd arfaethedig a wneir o fewn eu wardiau.

PENDERFYNWYD:

- (i) Yn amodol ar unrhyw sylwadau ychwanegol ar y Strategaeth Rheoli Llifogydd Lleol drafft y dylid eu cyflwyno i'r Uwch Beiriannydd: Rheoli Risg Llifogydd erbyn 9 Rhagfyr, 2013, y Pwyllgor yn cefnogi'r cynnig i symud ymlaen i ymgynghoriad cyhoeddus gyda'r ymgyngoreion arfaethedig a restrwyd yn Atodiad 1.
- (ii) Yn amodol ar y materion a godwyd, i nodi'r sylwadau a'r camau a gymerwyd gan y Cyngor ac eraill mewn ymateb i argymhellion yr adroddiadau ymchwiliad i'r llifogydd Tachwedd 2012.
- *(iii)* Adroddiad dilynol ar weithredu'r Strategaeth a datblygiadau eraill ar faterion sy'n ymwneud â llifogydd yn cael ei gyflwyno i'r Pwyllgor yn ystod yr haf 2014.

Cyflwynodd yr Aelod Arweiniol ar gyfer Tir y Cyhoedd, y Cynghorydd David Smith, Raglen Cyfalaf Priffyrdd ddrafft 2014/2015 a Chynnydd ar Strategaeth Ddrafft (a ddosbarthwyd yn flaenorol) i ddiweddaru'r Aelodau ac i alluogi'r Aelodau i drafod y fersiwn ddiweddaraf y Rhaglen o fewn yr amserlen angenrheidiol ar gyfer cyflwyno achos busnes i Lywodraeth Cymru i'w hystyried o dan y Fenter Benthyca Llywodraeth Leol (LGBI).

Roedd y rhaglen ddrafft wedi cael ei chyflwyno i Grwpiau Ardal Prestatyn, Dyffryn Dyfrdwy a Rhuthun (MAG) ar gyfer eu sylwadau. Byddai'r Rhaglen Ddrafft hefyd yn mynd i'r MAGau eraill ar gyfer eu sylwadau. Mae'r adborth gan y MAGau hyd yma wedi bod yn gadarnhaol a dim ond mân newidiadau a wnaed i'r Rhaglen Drafft.

Mae ail ran yr adroddiad yn ymwneud â'r strategaeth yn symud ymlaen. Mae cyfarfod wedi'i drefnu i'w gynnal ar 3 Rhagfyr gydag Aelodau i drafod sut i fynd â'r strategaeth yn ei blaen. Byddai'n fater o fynd i'r afael â risg a Sir Ddinbych yn bod yn agored i'w herio.

Roedd angen i'r Cod Ymarfer gael ei mireinio, ac ar hynny byddai'n cael ei gyflwyno i'r Cabinet i'w gymeradwyo.

Gofynnir i Aelodau dderbyn rhestr gyflawn o waith cynnal a chadw priffyrdd a nodwyd ar draws y sir (gan gynnwys prosiectau hynny na flaenoriaethwyd ar gyfer 2014/15 ynghyd â rhesymau pam nad ydynt yn flaenoriaeth).

Gofynnwyd am adroddiad gwybodaeth ar Bolisi'r Cyngor ar arwyddion ar ochr y ffordd (a Llywodraeth Cymru mewn perthynas â Cefnffyrdd). Mynegodd yr aelodau bryder bod arwyddion hysbysebu digwyddiadau, nawdd a busnesau yn cael eu gosod ar hyd y ffyrdd ac ar gylchfannau ar draws y sir. Nid oedd nifer o'r arwyddion yn cydymffurfio â Pholisi laith Gymraeg y Cyngor a gallai rhai hyd yn oed fod yn beryglus i yrwyr a cherddwyr fel ei gilydd, yn enwedig ar gyffyrdd, cylchfannau ac ati, gan eu bod yn amharu ar welededd.

PENDERFYNWYD bod y Pwyllgor Archwilio Cymunedau yn:

Cyflwynodd yr Aelod Arweiniol dros Gyllid ac Asedau, y Cynghorydd Julian Thompson-Hill, yr adroddiad ynghylch Caniatáu Prydlesi Tir ac Adeiladau'r Cyngor i Grwpiau Cymunedol a'r Polisïau a Phrosesau sy'n gysylltiedig (dosbarthwyd yn flaenorol). Byddai'r adroddiad yn darparu gwybodaeth am Bolisi'r Cyngor ar ganiatáu prydlesi yn arbennig i grwpiau cymunedol, nifer y prydlesi presennol, pa mor aml y'i hadolygir a'r prosesau ar gyfer caniatau, rheoli a phenderfynu ar unrhyw ostyngiad yn y taliadau a godir.

In the West Rhyl Regeneration Area we are trying to create an attractive neighbourhood where working people will want to live

What's going well?

Overall the project status remains very good although there has been some delay with the target dates for plans for refurbishment of properties in the various blocks. The table below details amended anticipated target dates

Phase 2 demolition of Aquarium Street/John Street/Hope Place and Abbey Street commences January 20th 2014 through until March 2014. Excellent progress continues with the resettlement programme with 99 households in the rented sector being relocated with no negative issues as at the end of December 2013. There are 49 household to re-locate this financial year and a further 6 scheduled for next financial year. In respect of privately owned properties, 28 in total, all properties will be vested in the Council between February and March 2014. Negotiation to finalise terms continues

Capita have now completed the public consultation exercise with attendance disappointing despite widespread awareness raising. The outcome of the consultation days and previous surveys carried out is that in general the public wish to see a pleasant green area in which families can enjoy peaceful recreation which is safe, secure and well maintained. The concept design has been developed but is subject to further amendments subject to comments from stakeholders. The concept is not being presented to Cabinet as previously reported as upon checking the agreed process, Council minutes record that those powers were delegated to the Project Board which will consider the proposals on 16th January 2014

The project budget remains well managed and within parameters

What concerns us and what are we doing about it?

The Project Delivery Confidence remains at yellow, despite concerns around re-settlement issues having been allayed due to the excellent work carried out by the Officer with these responsibilities. The project remains quite a challenge to deliver within the funding timeframe, but is being monitored and well managed.

Outlook

A number of risks remain, however these are considered and managed by the Project Co ordination Group as the project progresses.

Appendix 1b Town Centre Highlight Report January 2014

What's going well?

Following the transfer of responsibility for town centre events to the County Council, an exciting Christmas programme was successfully delivered following the Christmas lights switch on by Brian McFadden on 28th November. The data from the camera in the High Street showed an increase in footfall on three of the four Saturdays in the run up to Christmas compared to the equivalent days in the previous year which is positive.

A task and finish group has continued its work on the development of a town centre strategy in conjunction with the development of a Town & Area Plan for Rhyl.

North Wales Police have initiated discussions about the replacement of the existing analogue radio link system with new digital equipment which could also serve Prestatyn town centre. The County Council is exploring the suitability of this project for a placement for Coleg Llandrillo Police Studies foundation degree students.

What concerns us and what are we doing about it?

Following the decision of the Minister for Housing & Regeneration not to invite a second stage application from Rhyl for funding through the Vibrant & Viable Places Framework, details of the application process for the remaining funds have yet to be publicised and these are not now expected until February at the earliest.

Traders had expressed their concern about the impact on their businesses from the enforcement of the existing Traffic Management Order which restricts cars from entering the northern most part of the High Street between 5pm and 10am. A site meeting was arranged for the traders with representatives of North Wales Police and the County Council Traffic Management & Parking section after which a door to door consultation was undertaken jointly by traders and County Council Economic & Business Development to inform a review of the existing Order.

Following the departure of the Town Centre Manager, members of the Town Centre Management Group are continuing to look at best practice from other towns to inform the development of a successor post and a meeting with the Town Centre Management Group in Colwyn Bay is expected to take place shortly.

Outlook

Whilst the Minister's decision about the Vibrant & Viable Places application was disappointing, there remains an opportunity to apply for the funding which has been ring-fenced for unsuccessful applicants and there should also be an opportunity to enhance this with match funding from the new European structural funds programme commencing in 2014 and deliver a significant investment programme in the town centre. The new arrangements for town centre management and the development of the strategy for the town centre will enable partners to work together effectively to secure a sustainable future for the town centre.

Future delivery options for the facilities currently operated by Clwyd Leisure were to be considered by the County Council's Cabinet on 14th January.

Honey Club

Pre-application consultations about the design of the hotel proposed for the site of the former Honey Club have been taking place with the County Council's Planning & Public Protection service and a Planning application from the chosen developer will follow. It is still anticipated that the hotel should be completed and operating by autumn 2014.

Following the confirmation of the Compulsory Purchase Order for the adjacent burnt out property at 25/26 West Parade, the "cooling off" period which is built into the statutory process has now expired which means that it is now possible to enter the site to complete the demolition and this is expected to be completed by the end of next month.

Rhyl Harbour

Work has been continuing on the construction of the quayside building and this is expected to be completed by early 2014.

The Harbour Empowerment Order process will start to make progress as soon as the scoping exercise to define the extent of 'works' orders to be included, has been completed. The

County Council needs to provide technical input to inform the scoping report, but given the resource demands of the construction programme, this has not yet been completed.

New Rhyl brand and website

Work on the development of the new website utilising the new brand is nearing completion and it is expected to go live by the end of January.

Orientation & Signage Strategy

Consultants have been appointed to develop an orientation and signage strategy for the town. An inception meeting has taken place and analysis drawings are expected by the end of the month.

What concerns us and what are we doing about it?

The Ocean Plaza site continues to be an eyesore adjacent to the Harbour but a Planning application for a revised scheme was received from the developers on 2nd December. The new scheme would involve the construction of a food store, 4 non-food retail units, café, restaurant, family pub and hotel, petrol filling station and an electricity sub-station all within the boundary of the plot owned by the developer.

The Grange Hotel also continues to be an eyesore on the seafront but after it failed to sell at auction, it was purchased by an experienced developer based in the Midlands who has been in discussion with the County Council's Development Control & Compliance section about the potential for the redevelopment of the site.

The operator who was interested in developing a cable ski attraction at Marine Lake has withdrawn from the project. However, another operator approached the County Council to explore the potential for developing a related activity on the beach and is also interested in the cable ski project.

Outlook

Progress on the Rhyl Harbour project combined with the completion of the demolition of the Honey Club is a tangible sign of our regeneration programme moving forward. There remains a considerable amount of work to do, however the prospects are positive.

Green Links

A website for the Green Links Route is currently being put together.

Quotations for the Information Portals are currently being scored - 2 in Conwy and 2 in Denbighshire and which will be located at Rhyl Harbour and the Scala Cinema, in Prestatyn. Visitor Counters are to be installed and a Monitoring Plan has been drawn up.

The Car Park at Marsh Tracks has now been surfaced and some artwork is being developed.

Area Renewal

Phase 12/2 - Nos. 11a - 29 Church Street, Rhyl

This phase commenced in September 2013 and is approx. 50% complete. It involves the refurbishment of the external envelope of 9no. large terraced properties and also damp proofing, electrical/heating upgrades internally. B&W Builders are the contractors and completion is anticipated in May 2014.

3 Brighton Road, Rhyl

This is an eyesore property in a prominent central Rhyl location and is being carried out as an individual property refurbishment under the Renewal Area Scheme following previous works in Brighton Road. Works will involve the complete renovation of the external envelope and heating and electrical upgrades internally. Work is anticipated to commence in February 2014.

Phase 13/1 - Nos. 16-40 Brighton Road (evens only), Nos 1-4 Thorpe Street & Nos 43-49 Bath Street (evens only), Rhyl

This is the next proposed Renewal Area Phase for 2014-15.We have written to all eligible property owners in December but have had a disappointing response with only 10 expressions of interest. Initial surveys will commence in January 2014.

Coastal Defence (Phase 3)

Arbed

Discussions have been continuing with the principal contractor about how take up of the "Year 2" phase by property owners in the Rhyl West 3 area might be increased and whether there are any opportunities for local sub-contractors to undertake some of the work required.

What concerns us and what are we doing about it?

The need to develop a more coherent and focussed approach to making Rhyl a more attractive place to live and work was recognised at the Review in November 2012. This work will be progressed through the development of a Town & Area Plan for Rhyl.

Outlook

Rhyl currently fares poorly when compared with other North Wales locations as a place to choose to live or set up business. There are a number of reasons for this, including the poor image of the town and distance from the A55. That said, it has some significant assets which we are perhaps not making the most of, including an attractive setting with beach and easy access to countryside, along with affordable property prices. Activity and results in all the regeneration workstreams will be required to start to improve the situation, but there is also a need for the more focussed investment strategy for the town.

GOVERNANCE PRINCIPLES AND MANAGEMENT

Roles and Responsibilities



Purpose of the Programme Board

The Economic and Community Ambition Programme Board is tasked with driving this programme forward, delivering the outcomes and benefits we expect to achieve for businesses and residents in Denbighshire. At the highest level the programme board is responsible for:

- Clearly and consistently communicating the programme vision, particularly the desired outcomes
- A focus on managing the benefits and the internal and external threats to their achievement
- Co-ordination of a number of projects and their interdependencies in pursuit of the vision
- Leadership, influence, management and directing the transition from 'old' to 'new', including handling cultural change required within the council

Role of the Programme Board

The board must concentrate on effectively delivering strategic change. It must achieve this through:

- Ensuring money is not wasted on projects that do not deliver benefits
- Ensuring that scarce resources are prioritised to deliver maximum benefit
- Continuously improving communication with stakeholders
- Commitment to securing adequate resources to deliver the programme
- Providing better focus on the real drivers of change
- Delivering tangible results
- Involving service users and providers early on and throughout the programme

In undertaking this role the Programme Board will need to:

- Discuss the strengths, weaknesses and challenges facing Denbighshire and identify and share best practice
- Discuss the application of alternative ways of providing services
- Identify, scope and justify candidate projects
- Analyse the quick wins, longer term wins and decide which projects to approve
- Select those projects and programmes which will generate significant benefits for businesses and residents
- $\circ\;$ Justify, plan, commence and implement projects to an agreed set of targeted outcomes and benefits
- o Co-ordinate the delivery of the agreed set of projects
- Involve stakeholders and ensure that projects respond to emergent evidence and other changes in the political and operational context
- o Review and maintain the quality and ambition of projects
- o Follow through to implement projects and realise projected benefits

What the Programme Board will not do:

- Micro manage projects
- Take a democratic approach to decision making
- Direct project managers outside of the agreed process
- Bring 'favourite' projects to the table
- Undermine decisions made at the Board

Programme Senior Responsible Owner responsibilities:

- Ensure the Programme stays focused on achieving the vision
- Ensure communication of the Programme vision and outcomes
- Ensure that the Programme remains aligned with Corporate Plan outcomes
- Ensure that the benefits envisaged by the Programme are realised (for example by ensuring that resources are contributed by service areas)
- Report progress to the Corporate Executive Team
- Provide a link with service areas to direct and manage projects, risks, issues, decisions
- Chair and provide strategic management support to the Board
- Provide day-to-day executive management of the Programme
- Provide support to the Programme Manager to manage risks and resolve issues

Programme Manager responsibilities:

- Plan the programme (including assessing and approving component project plans)
- Provide management and monitoring of overall progress
- Be responsible for organising quality assurance and overall integrity of the programme
- Manage the dependencies and interfaces between projects
- Manage the risks to the programme's successful outcomes
- Initiate extra actions where gaps in the programme are identified
- Coordinate the compilation of outcome reports and relevant papers
- Support outcome owners, middle managers and project managers where appropriate
- Establish, convene and manage meetings, events and activities associated with the programme

Staff acting in the Business Change Management role will be responsible for:

- Identifying projects that contribute to achieving programme outcomes and benefits
- Working with the programme manager to ensure that the scope of each project covers the necessary
 aspects required to deliver the products or services that will lead to benefits
- Assisting the programme manager in identifying, defining and tracking progress towards programme outcomes and benefits
- Ensuring that programme outcomes and benefits are met by exploiting the capability brought about by projects within the programme
- Leading activities associated with benefits realisation and ensuring continued accrual of benefits can be achieved and measured after the programme has been completed
- Ensuring that business as usual is maintained during the transition and that changes are effectively integrated into the business
- Preparing the affected business areas for the transition to new ways of working
- Optimising the timing of the release of project deliverables into the business operations
- Attending Programme / Project Board meetings where required

Project Manager responsibilities:

- Assume responsibility for the day-to-day management of their project
- Design projects with programme outcomes and benefits in mind
- Ensure that their project completes on time and to budget
- Ensure that projects adhere to the Corporate Project Management Methodology
- Ensure Verto is kept up to date with relevant project information
- Attend Board meetings as required

Board relationship with CET/SLT

Programme level authority to deliver strategic change and to take decisions about developing the local economy derives from Cabinet handed down by Corporate Executive Team. The Programme SRO (Corporate Director, Economic and Community Ambition) is empowered to make judgements as to which decisions can be made at the Board and relayed directly to relevant Service Areas, and which decisions need to be referred back to CET and/or Cabinet. The latter are most likely to be decisions that will impact upon the wider organisation, those which may attract significant negative publicity or where the Programme Board view differs significantly from that of a Service Area.

Board relationship with DCC Service Areas

Communication between the Board and DCC Service Areas is two way:

- The Board may report to relevant Heads of Service the outcome of decisions on strategic issues where they relate to or impact on service delivery. The Programme Lead may also give specific direction or instruction to Heads of Service as a result of decisions made at the Board.
- Heads of Service will refer relevant project briefs / business cases to the Board to ensure that they are considered within the broader context of the Board's remit and to secure Board approval before setting up a project. From time to time Heads of Service will also be asked to report on progress with service plans and business as usual activities where these have influence on the programme outcomes.

Board relationship with Scrutiny Committees

The Board may be asked to present its programme to Scrutiny Committees, who will play a key role in providing assurance to the Council that the programme and its Board are delivering in line with the Corporate Plan.
