- Gwnaethwyd y pwylgor yn ymwybodol bod Prif Weithredwr Bwrdd Iechyd Prifysgol Betsi Cadwaladr wedi ymddiswyddo a bod Prif Weithredwr dros dro wedi'i benodi ers y cyfarfod blaenorol.
- Teimlai'r aelodau nad oedd y trafodaethau a gynhaliwyd yn y cyfarfod diwethaf mewn perthynas ag Ysbyty Dinbych, Prosiect Ysbyty Cymuned Gogledd Dinbych a Phrosiectau Cyfalaf y Bwrdd Iechyd yn Sir Ddinbych yn darparu unrhyw wybodaeth ychwanegol i'r pwylgor. Roedd hyn oherwydd bod y materion wedi'u trafod mewn nifer o bwylgorau eraill.
- Tynnwyd sylw at eitem 8 ar y rhaglen a chwestiynau a gafodd aelod gan Swyddog Archwilio Cymru. Teimlai'r aelod nad oedd ganddo yr wybodaeth ddigonol ar gyfer y cwestiynau. Y Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol: Ymatebodd cymunedau i'r pwynt trwy dynnu sylw, fel arweinydd y prosiect, na ellid ateb rhai o'r cwestiynau a ofynnwyd felly nad oeddent yn adlewyrchu'n wael ar yr aelod.

5 **POLISIAU'R CYNGOR A'R ASIANTAETH CEFNFFYRDD AR GYFER CYNNAL A CHADW YMYLON FFYRDD A PHERTHI A GWASGARU PLALADDWYR**

Cyflwynodd yr Aelod Arweiniol Prifyrdd, Effaith Amgylcheddol, Gwastraff a Theithio Cynaliadwy yr adroddiad (a ddosbarthwyd yn flaenorol) ochr yn ochr â'r Aelod Arweiniol Tai a Chymunedau, a'r Pennaeth Prifyrdd, Cyfleusterau a Gwasanaethau Amgylcheddol. Hefyd roedd David Evans, Dirprwy Bennaeth Gwasanaeth a Mark Watson-Jones, Cydlynnydd Amgylcheddol o Asiantaeth Cefnffyrdd Gogledd a Chanolbarth Cymru.

Cyflwynwyd yr adroddiad i aelodau ar gais y Pwyllgor ar ôl iddo ystyried Cynllun Cyflawni Dyletswydd Bioamrywiaeth drafft y Cyngor yn ystod haf 2019. Yn ogystal, gofynnwyd am wybodaeth am ddefnydd y Cyngor o blaladdwyr. Roedd yr aelodau'n ceisio sicrwydd bod polisiau cynnal a chadw ymylon/gwrychoedd prifyrdd Sir Ddinbych yn cael eu gweithredu'n gyson ledled y sir. Wrth i dair cefnffordd, a oedd yn gyfrifoldeb Asiantaeth Cefnffyrdd Gogledd a Chanolbarth Cymru groesi'r sir, roedd cynrychiolwyr Asiantaeth Cefnffyrdd Gogledd a Chanolbarth Cymru hefyd wedi'u gwahodd i'r cyfarfod i drafod gyda'r Pwyllgor ei bolisiau mewn perthynas â chynnal a chadw ymylon/gwrychoedd a'r defnydd o blaladdwyr.

Yn ystod y drafodaeth, dywedwyd wrth y Pwyllgor:

- er y bu cryn sylw a si yn y cyfryngau ynglych diogelwch Glyffosad a'r defnydd ohono, nid oes unrhyw chwynladdwr systemig effeithiol amgen wedi ei ddarganfod na'i ddatblygu. Roedd nifer o awdurdodau yn archwilio dulliau amgen ac roedd gwyddonwyr yn ymchwilio i gynhyrchion amgen posibl, ond hyd yma Glyffosad oedd y cynyrrch mwyaf effeithiol o'i fath ar y farchnad. Pe bai'r Cyngor ac Asiantaeth Cefnffyrdd Gogledd a Chanolbarth Cymru yn defnyddio dulliau neu gynyrrch amgen, bydden nhw naill ai'n lafurddwys neu'n ddrud i'w prynu.
- Caiff Glyffosad ei drwyddedu a'i ddefnyddio gan holl lywodraethau'r DU. Ar hyn o bryd, dyna'r unig ateb ymarferol ar gyfer delio gyda chwyn ar draws

rhwydwaith y priffyrrdd. Roedd y math o chwynladdwr systematig a ddefnyddid gan y Cyngor ac Asiantaeth Cefnffyrdd Gogledd a Chanolbarth Cymru o safon diwydiannol a barnwyd ei fod yn gwbl ddiogel pe bai'n cael ei gymhwys gan weithwyr hyfforddedig a chontractwyr a oedd yn cydymffurfio ag arferion gwaith diogel y cawsant hyfforddiant arnynt. Cafodd y plaladdwr ei chwistrellu ddwywaith y flwyddyn ar ffyrdd y sir.

- Cafodd dulliau eraill, megis triniaeth ewyn poeth, eu defnyddio mewn meysydd penodol o'r sir, h.y. Safleoedd o Ddiddordeb Gwyddonol Arbennig. Fodd bynnag, roedd y defnydd ohono yn gyfyngedig ac felly ni fyddai'n ymarferol i'w ddefnyddio ar draws rhwydwaith y briffordd;
- Weithiau byddai trigolion yn dychryn wrth weld gweithwyr yn rhoi plaladdwyr mewn mannau cyhoeddus, yn gwisgo dillad amddiffynnol a masgiau wyneb pan oedd aelodau o'r cyhoedd yn bresennol. Fodd bynnag, honnwyd bod y plaladdwyr yn ddiogel i'r cyhoedd. Y rhesymau pam roedd gweithwyr yn gwisgo'r dillad amddiffynnol oedd i gydymffurfio â rheolau iechyd a diogelwch yn ymwneud â chysylltiad hirfaith i gemegau, gan eu bod yn delio â nhw o ddydd i ddydd. Nid oedd cysylltiad byrdymor, fel yr oedd y cyhoedd yn ei brofi, yn peri risg i iechyd
- Roedd Cyngor Sir Ddinbych ac Asiantaeth Cefnffyrdd Gogledd a Chanolbarth Cymru yn rhan o Rwydwaith Bioamrywiaeth Gogledd Ddwyrain Cymru. Roedd hyn yn sicrhau bod pob asiantaeth a oedd yn gweithredu yn yr ardal yn defnyddio arferion bioamrywiaeth ac iechyd a diogelwch tebyg wrth dorri ymylon glaswellt a chwistrellu plaladdwyr. Yn ogystal, gosodwyd pob contract cynnal a chadw priffyrrdd yn dilyn proses dendro ffurfiol. Lluniodd yr awdurdodau priffyrrdd fanylebau'r contract a oedd yn nodi materion fel amlder toriadau, chwistrellu cemegol a'r mathau o gemegau i'w defnyddio, pob un ohonynt yn seiliedig ar ddeddfwriaeth a rheoliadau cyfredol. Byddai'r holl gcontractau yn cael eu monitro er mwyn sicrhau cydymffuriaeth gyda manyleb y contract. Ni fyddai contractau bob amser yn cael eu gosod ar sail pris yn unig, roedd ansawdd y gwaith hefyd yn ffactor. Roedd yn bwysig felly i aelodau etholedig hysbysu'r asiantaethau am waith o ansawdd da yn ogystal â gwaith o ansawdd gwael;
- Roedd y Cyngor ac Asiantaeth Cefnffyrdd Gogledd a Chanolbarth Cymru yn cyfathrebu gyda gweithredwyr a chontractwyr penodedig mewn perthynas â lleoliad gwarchodfeydd natur ar ochr y ffordd a sut i'w hamddiffyn yn ystod ymarferion torri ymylon a chwistrellu chwyn;
- Roedd mwyafrif y gwrychoedd ledled y sir yn rhai perchnogaeth breifat, felly roedd y tirdeddianwyr yn gyfrifol am eu cynnal a'u cadw

Pwysleisiodd aelodau gwledig yr angen i drefnu toriadau ymylon yn effeithiol ar ffyrdd gwledig i gyd-fynd â'r amrywiannau yn y tymor tyfu o flwyddyn i flwyddyn, a hefyd i sicrhau bod yr ymylon yn cael eu torri cyn i rywfaint o'r llystyfiant galedu, h.y. gorhyfail. Roedden nhw o'r farn felly bod angen elfen o hyblygrwydd ar gyfer polisiau torri ymylon. Ar y sail hwn, penderfynodd y Pwyllgor ar y canlynol:

6 TRWYDDEDU YCHWANEGOL I DAI AMLFEDDIANNAETH

Cyflwynodd y Pennaeth Cynllunio, Gwarchod y Cyhoedd a'r Gwasanaethau Cefn Gwlad yr adroddiad, Trwydded Ychwanegol i Dai Amlfeddiannaeth, ochr yn ochr â swyddogion, Rheolwr Busnes Gwarchod y Cyhoedd, Rheolwr yr Amgylchedd Adeiledig a Swyddog Gwarchod y Cyhoedd (lechyd yr Amgylchedd).

Roedd Swyddogion wedi gofyn bod y Pwyllgor Craffu yn ystyried cynnig i adnewyddu Cynllun Trwydded Ychwanegol i Dai Amlfeddiannaeth y Cyngor, sydd ar hyn o bryd yn gweithredu yn Y Rhyl, yn ogystal ag ymestyn y cynllun i gynnwys eiddo perthnasol ym Mhrestatyn, Dinbych a Llangollen. Cynghorwyd y Pwyllgor gan yr Aelod Arweiniol fod Heddlu Gogledd Cymru a Gwasanaeth Tân ac Achub Gogledd Cymru yn falch o effeithiolrwydd y cynllun cyfredol sy'n gweithredu mewn ardaloedd o fewn y Rhyl ac yn awyddus i'r cynllun gael ei adnewyddu. Yng ngoleuni llwyddiant y cynllun presennol, roedd y Cyngor yn awyddus i'w ymestyn i dair tref arall yn y sir, Dinbych, Llangollen a Phrestatyn er mwyn sicrhau y byddai tai amlfeddiannaeth nad ydynt yn dod o dan y cynllun gorfodol bellach yn cael eu rheoleiddio'n fwy effeithiol. Pwrpas y cynllun oedd sicrhau bod tai amlfeddiannaeth yn cael eu cynnal i safon resymol, a'u bod yn darparu llety addas a diogel i'r bobl a oedd yn byw yno. Yn dilyn ystyriaeth gan y Pwyllgor Craffu, y cam nesaf fyddai mynd â'r Cynllun i bob un o Grwpiau Ardal yr Aelodau perthnasol a chychwyn ymgynghoriad cyhoeddus 10 wythnos ar y Cynllun cyn ei gyflwyno i'r Cabinet i'w gymeradwyo a'i fabwysiadu.

Amlinelloedd swyddogion y buddion o gael Cynllun Trwyddedu Ychwanegol ar gyfer Tai Amlfeddiannaeth, gan ddweud bod y Cyngor wedi archwilio eiddo a gwmpesir gan y cynlluniau gorfodol ac ychwanegol i sicrhau cydymffurfiad. Roedd hefyd yn caniatáu i'r Cyngor weithio gyda landordiaid preifat i sicrhau gwelliannau, a oedd yn ei dro yn helpu i leihau nifer y gwagleoedd yn y sir, cynyddu nifer yr unedau tai sydd ar gael yn Sir Ddinbych, yn ogystal â gwella perfformiad y Sir yn erbyn nifer yr eiddo gorlawn a gofnodwyd ym Mynegai Amddifadedd Lluosog Cymru.

Yn ystod trafodaethau'r Pwyllgor, dyma a wnaeth yr Aelod Arweiniol a'r Swyddogion:

- cynghori bod ymddygiad gwrthgymdeithasol mewn Tai Amlfeddiannaeth yn y sector preifat yn gofyn am gymryd camau monitro a gorfodi mwy llym lle bo angen;
- cadarnhau bod y Tîm Gorfodaeth Tai yn cynnwys chwe aelod o staff cyfwerth â llawn amser ac yn hyderus, yn seiliedig ar ddata hygrych cyfredol, y byddai hyn yn ddigon i reoli'r cynllun trwyddedu ychwanegol estynedig arfaethedig. Elwodd y Tîm hefyd ar incwm a dderbyniwyd gan ffioedd a roddodd ychydig o hyblygrwydd iddynt gyflogi staff ychwanegol os oedd angen;
- dweud bod erlyn landordiaid nad oeddent yn cydymffurfio yn broses hir a chymhleth, a dyna'r rheswm am y nifer isel o erlyniadau a gynhaliwyd yn

ystod y deng mlynedd y bu'r Cynllun yn gweithredu mewn rhannau o'r Rhyl. Roedd deialog, a chamau gorfodi neu waharddiad os oedd angen, yn offer rheoli llawer mwy effeithiol oherwydd er mwyn sicrhau eu hincwm o'u heiddo byddai landlordiaid yn gweithio gyda'r Cyngor yn y pen draw, gyda'r bwriad o gydymffurfio â'r gofynion;

- esbonio'r cymhlethdodau sy'n gysylltiedig â'r Rheoliadau Cynllunio, Adeiladu a Thrwyddedu ond yn pwysleisio bod y tri gwasanaeth yn cydweithio'n agos ar faterion sy'n peri pryder;
- dweud bod y Gwasanaeth yn dibynnu'n helaeth ar wybodaeth adweithiol gan denantiaid, y cyhoedd ac aelodau etholedig ynghylch digwyddiadau posibl o ddiffyg cydymffurfio. Gweithiodd yn agos hefyd gyda Gwasanaeth Digartrefedd y Cyngor ac asiantaethau allanol mewn perthynas â mynediad at wasanaethau tai a digartrefedd;
- cadarnhau bod y Gwasanaeth wedi defnyddio data Rhentu Doeth Cymru i gymharu data cofrestru a thrwyddedu â'r hyn a gedwir gan y Cyngor;
- dweud yr eir i'r afael â phob cwyn a geid mewn perthynas â thramgwyddau gorfodi tai o fewn pum niwrnod; a
- dweud nad oedd y Cynllun Trwyddedu Ychwanegol yn berthnasol i Landlordiaid Cymdeithasol Cofrestredig gan eu bod yn ofynnol iddynt gydymffurfio â'r un rheoliadau tai â stoc dai'r Cyngor, roedd y Cynllun Trwyddedu Ychwanegol yn berthnasol i landlordiaid y sector preifat. Fodd bynnag, pe bai gan aelodau bryderon am unrhyw eiddo neu denantiaid Landlordiaid Cymdeithasol Cofrestredig, gallent eu hanfon ymlaen at Dîm Gorfodi Tai y Cyngor a byddent yn eu codi gyda'r Landlordiaid Cymdeithasol Cofrestredig gan eu bod yn cwrdd â nhw yn rheolaidd

Gan ymateb i bryderon aelodau ynghylch a allai cyflwyno'r Cynllun Trwyddedu Ychwanegol i drefi penodol yn y sir ac nid i bob tref a phentref gael effaith niweidiol drwy achosi i landlordiaid diegwyddor weithredu mewn ardaloedd nad ydynt wedi'u cwmpasu gan y cynllun, dywedodd swyddogion y byddent yn monitro'r sefyllfa'n agos. Gellid gwneud hyn drwy weithio'n agos gyda'r Gwasanaethau Amgylcheddol drwy fonitro data gwastraff ac ailgylchu ar gyfer ardal rhag ofn eu bod yn gwagio cynwysyddion gwastraff lluosog ar gyfer eiddo sengl. Mynegodd yr aelodau eu pryderon hefyd am y cynnydd ymddangosiadol yn nifer y ceisiadau cynllunio ar gyfer trosi anheddu sengl yn anheddu aml-ddeiliadaeth a ystyriwyd gan Bwyllgor Cynllunio'r Cyngor yn ystod y misoedd diwethaf, boed hynny am eu troi'n Dai Amlfeddiannaeth neu'n fflatiau annibynnol.

Summary of Recovery Theme:

Housing is one of the Recovery Themes identified by the Chief Executive in the report shared with Cabinet in April.

This report identifies the areas that merit particular attention with regard to Community Housing with regard to supporting Council tenants and others to recover from the period of lockdown and adapt to an environment where Covid and risks associated with it.

Key Objectives:**1. Repairs & Maintenance:**

- 1.1. Repairs to Council Housing stock have been limited to urgent repairs only.
It will be necessary to design and implement a plan for catching up on planned maintenance work while still maintaining social distancing rules
- 1.2. Tenants will need to be effectively engaged to enable this work to be completed safely

2. Voids:

- 2.1. No work has been undertaken during lockdown to ready empty properties for new tenants. This will need to be scheduled in line with social distancing rules.

3. SARTH and Homelessness:

- 3.1. During lockdown the SARTH process has been suspended, although people have been able to join the register. The number of people waiting for Housing now stands at c1,200

- 3.2. Meanwhile there are currently c136 households who are in emergency or temporary accommodation who will need to find permanent homes
- 3.3. Agreement with the social housing providers in Denbighshire has been secured to address the homeless situation before returning to the SARTH process. The decision to suspend SARTH for approximately three months post-lockdown is likely to be a Lead Member delegated decision.
- 3.4. Work has been suspended in terms of supporting the establishment of a Social Lettings Agency in Denbighshire (in partnership with Cartrefi Conwy). This will need to be addressed to support the work of the homeless team going forward.

4. Rents:

- 4.1. While rent arrears have not grown exponentially over the period many tenants have registered for Universal Credit since lockdown.
- 4.2. It will be important to continue to engage positively with tenants whose income has been affected by Covid, for example by working closely with officers in Working Denbighshire to support tenants into new employment.
- 4.3. Rentsense (the Mobysoft product) will help housing officers to identify those at risk of falling behind on rent and this will need to be implemented.

5. Tenant Support:

- 5.1. During lockdown Housing Officers have been in touch with residents through the proactive calling. This work has reaped rewards and embedding this into new ways of working will be important in maintaining good tenant relationships.
- 5.2. Plans will need to be developed and implemented with regard to the use of community spaces within the schemes (in particular the Older People's schemes)
- 5.3. It may be appropriate to establish a 'good neighbour' role which supports tenants individually rather than supporting community groups

6. Community Development:

- 6.1. Building even more effective working relationships with community groups and the Third Sector has been a defining element of DCC's response to the crisis, and it is important to continue to build on these relationships within localities
- 6.2. Helping to build capacity for tenant associations.

6.3. Communities across Denbighshire will have been affected by the social distancing rules and lockdown and it will be important to support the re-establishment of mutually supportive communities to effect long term community resilience.

7. Capital Projects:

7.1. The Corporate Plan ambition to create 170 new Council properties was behind schedule before lockdown and it will be necessary to review what is practicable now, given that costs and timescales will increase with the need to put preventative measures in place.

8. Housing Asset Strategy

8.1. This strategy was being developed before lockdown and is now strategically important to inform the strategic direction of Housing development over the next 30 years.

8.2. The strategy will outline the requirements for Council Housing in Denbighshire, with regard to community demands, demographic change and the sustainability agenda, alongside rent policy, borrowing strategy and access to government capital funds.

Key Milestones (include any decision points e.g. Cabinet):

- Gradual ramping up of reactive repairs, capital repairs & void works has already started (May)
- Suspension of SARTH for three months – Lead Member delegated decision (tbc)
- Resumption of Rentsense implementation (ICT-led project) end June
- Housing Asset Strategy – first draft ready by end June

Risks & Opportunities:

1. Risk that there will be criticism of the suspension of SARTH
2. Risk that DCC will not achieve its Corporate Plan objectives with regard to new builds
3. Risk that the SARTH waiting list will become too long if properties are not available to let
4. Risk to tenants, DCC staff and contractors in terms of spreading Covid if preventative measures are not adhered to.

5. Risk that costs and timescales for works will increase as measures are put in place to reduce the risk of spread of Covid.
6. Opportunity to build on closer relationships built with vulnerable tenants during lockdown by developing new model of support
7. Opportunity to build on closer working relationships developed with Community Groups through Covid

- 4.6. Fel enghraift, ar gyfer deunydd caled, rwbel a gwastraff DIY/adeiladu, mae Conwy ar hyn o bryd yn codi £2 y bag neu £20 y trelar. Mae bag yn golygu'r un maint â bag bach plastig tywod neu gerrig mân o siopau DIY arferol (neu debyg) sy'n gallu cael

eu codi'n ddiogel gan un person. Mae trelar yn cael ei ddiffinio fel trelar bach arferol ag un echel, gydag uchafswm llwyth o tua 750kg.

- 4.7. Mae ein polisi cyfredol ni eisoes yn dweud nad yw pethau fel rwbwl adeiladu, brics, teils na phridd yn cyfrif fel gwastraff domestig (hyd yn oed os ydynt yn dod o'r cartref), ac nid oes rhwymedigaeth arnom i dderbyn y rhain yn ein safleoedd. IMPACT ASSESSMENT SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION

Before we look in detail at the contribution and impact of the proposal, it is important to consider how the proposal is applying the sustainable development principle. This means that we must act "in a manner which seeks to ensure that the needs of the present are met without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs."

Score for the sustainability of the approach



(3 out of 4 stars) Actual score : 23 / 30.

Implications of the score

Involvement:

This score is lower because we intend only to consult a small section of stakeholders who are impacted by the changes. We are proposing to implement charges for some waste streams currently accepted for free (some in limited quantities) and do not intend to consult the wider public on these changes as the intention to do so has already been agreed in the last budget setting cabinet (in accepting a £100K savings proposal to review waste charges). Currently we do not allow charities to use the facilities to dispose of unsuitable donated waste. However, we do intend to consult with charity shops operating in Denbighshire to review our current position.

Collaboration/ Long Term

The joint procurement is proposed to be carried out through a concessions based contract of a minimum of 5 years, giving medium term confidence that benefits will be realised through a contract specification designed to optimise environmental benefits (through waste diversion from Energy to Waste to recycling and re-use , carbon reduction through less road mileage as residents across the two counties can access any of the 5 sites, and economic benefits - through income share arrangements and economies of scale). The terms will also provide flexibility to expand the collaborative approach regionally if successful to realise economies of scale and best practice learning across the region.

Prevention

Plans include proposals to provide on-site re-use outlets at least 1 Denbighshire HWRC (potential 2 by the end of the contract term) to ensure good quality items brought to the HWRC's are kept within our circular economy and not wasted, is a key additional benefit of this proposal, working with the operator and a charitable / third sector body). The new approach will also permanently adopt a booking system now trialling to prevent illegal use of the sites by traders, and the provision of an additional part time enforcement officer will ensure any illegal waste deposits are thoroughly investigated and suitable preventative measures are put in place (e.g. additional CCTV at known hot spot locations).


Integration

4. Manylion yr Adroddiad

- 4.1 Mae Erthygl 7 Cyfansoddiad Cyngor Sir Ddinbych yn nodi cylch gorchwyl, swyddogaethau ac aelodaeth pob Pwyllgor Craffu, yn ogystal â rheolau gweithdrefnau a trafodaethau.
- 4.2 Mae'r Cyfansoddiad yn amodi bod yn rhaid i bwyllgorau craffu'r Cyngor osod, ac adolygu'n rheolaidd, rhaglen ar gyfer eu gwaith i'r dyfodol. Trwy adolygu a blaenoriaethu materion, gall aelodau sicrhau bod y rhaglen waith yn cyflwyno agenda a arweinir gan yr aelodau.
- 4.3 Arfer sydd wedi'i fabwysiadu yn Sir Ddinbych ers nifer o flynyddoedd yw bod pwyllgorau archwilio'n cyfyngu ar nifer yr adroddiadau a ystyri mewn unrhyw gyfarfod i uchafswm o bedwar, yn ogystal ag adroddiad rhaglen waith y Pwyllgor ei hun. Nod y dull hwn yw hwyluso trafodaeth fanwl ac effeithiol ar bob pwnc.
- 4.4 Yn y blynnyddoedd diweddar mae Llywodraeth Cymru (LIC) ac Archwilio Cymru (AC) wedi tynnu sylw at yr angen i gryfhau rôl craffu ar draws Llywodraeth leol a gwasanaethau cyhoeddus yng Nghymru, gan gynnwys defnyddio craffu fel modd o ymgysylltu â phreswylwyr a defnyddwyr gwasanaeth. O hyn allan, disgwylir i graffu ymgysylltu'n well ac yn amlach â'r cyhoedd gyda bwriad i sicrhau penderfyniadau gwell a fydd yn y pen draw yn arwain at well canlyniadau i ddinasyddion. Bydd Archwilio Cymru yn mesur effeithiolrwydd craffu wrth gyflawni'r disgwyliadau hyn.

4.6 Ffurflenni Cynnig ar gyfer Craffu

Fel y crybwyllyd ym mharagraff 4.2 uchod, mae Cyfansoddiad y Cyngor yn gofyn i bwylgorau craffu baratoi ac adolygu rhaglen ar gyfer eu gwaith i'r dyfodol. Er mwyn cynorthwyo'r broses o flaenoriaethu adroddiadau, os yw'r swyddogion o'r farn fod pwnc yn haeddu'r amser i gael ei drafod ar raglen fusnes y Pwyllgor, mae'n rhaid iddynt wneud cais ffurfiol i'r Pwyllgor i ystyried derbyn adroddiad ar y pwnc hwnnw. Gwneir hyn trwy gyflwyno 'ffurflen gynnig' sy'n egluro pwrpas, pwysigrwydd a chanlyniadau posibl y pynciau a awgrymir. Does dim un ffurflen gynnig wedi dod i law gan swyddogion i'w ystyried yn y cyfarfod cyfredol.

5. Grŵp Cadeiryddion ac Is-Gadeiryddion Craffu

- 5.1 Yn ystod y cyfnod clo, dim ond penderfyniadau hanfodol ar gyfer busnes a wnaed gan y Cabinet ac Aelodau Arweiniol. Mae'r Cyngor rŵan yn ailgydio mewn nifer o wasanaethau pob dydd eraill yn ogystal â gwneud gwaith i gefnogi gwasanaethau'r Cyngor, busnesau lleol a chymunedau i adfer ar ôl ymateb i'r argyfwng a dod allan ohono.
- 5.2 Dan drefniadau archwilio'r Cyngor mae Grŵp Cadeiryddion ac Is-Gadeiryddion Craffu (GCIGC) yn gweithredu fel pwyllgor cydlynus. Cyfarfu'r grŵp drwy fideo gynhadledd ym mis Mehefin a Gorffennaf 2020 i ystyried sut orau i ailgydio yng ngwaith y pwyllgorau craffu yn dilyn cyfnod yr argyfwng COVID-19.
- 5.3 Roedd rhagleni gwaith i'r dyfodol y tri phwyllgor eisoes yn eithaf llawn cyn y pandemig coronafeirws. Roedd angen i'r Grŵp ystyried dull Craffu cyfan ar gyfer craffu ar y cynlluniau adfer pwysig a sut y gallai'r pwyllgorau reoli'r gwaith o ymgorffori'r eitemau yr oedd Craffu yn eu hystyried yn bwysig cyn y pandemig yn y rhagleni gwaith newydd i'r dyfodol.
- 5.4 I hwyluso hyn, cytunodd y Grŵp fod angen clirio eitemau sy'n weddill o ragleni gwaith pob pwyllgor, gan roi'r testunau hyn ar 'restr gadw' tra bo ymholaadau'n cael eu gwneud i benderfynu a yw'r materion yn dal yn gyfredol, yn gysylltiedig â gwaith adfer y Cyngor a pha bryd y mae disgwyl yn resymol i swyddogion fod mewn sefyllfa i adrodd arnynt i'r pwyllgorau. Byddai mabwysiadu'r dull hwn yn rhyddhau'r pwyllgorau yn eu cyfarfodydd cyntaf ers y cyfnod clo i ganolbwytio ar y cynlluniau cyflenwi drafft ar gyfer Blaenorïaethau Adferiad COVID-19 y Cyngor. Bydd gan Craffu, am weddill tymor y Cyngor hwn, ran bwysig iawn i'w chwarae wrth gefnogi adferiad y Cyngor o ymateb i'r pandemig a nodi'r gwersi a ddysgwyd ohono i helpu llunio modelau darparu gwasanaeth yn y dyfodol a chynlluniau i ymateb i unrhyw ddigwyddiadau tebyg a allai fod o'n blaenau. 
