## 5 PROSIECT YSBYTY CYMUNEDOL GOGLEDD SIR DDINBYCH

Cyflwynodd yr Aelod Arweiniol lechyd a Gofal Cymdeithasol, y Cynghorydd Elen Heaton y wybodaeth ddiweddaraf am Brosiect Ysbyty Cymunedol Gogledd Sir Ddinbych.

Dyweddodd wrth yr aelodau, er mai prosiect gan Fwrdd lechyd Prifysgol Betsi Cadwaladr (BIPBC) yw Ysbyty Cymunedol Gogledd Sir Ddinbych, roedd Cyngor Sir Ddinbych wedi ymrwymo i gefnogi'r prosiect hanfodol hwn.

Eglurwyd bod y Prosiect yn hanfodol oherwydd y pwysau a'r galw cynyddol ar Uned Frys a Damweiniau Ysbyty Glan Clwyd.

Eglurodd yr Aelod Arweiniol fod Bwrdd Partneriaeth Rhanbarthol Gogledd Cymru wedi gorfol draffio eu Cynllun Cyfalaf Strategol 10 mlynedd cyntaf, oedd bellach wedi'i gyflwyno i Lywodraeth Cymru. Roedd datblygu Ysbyty Brenhinol Alexandra yn un o dri phrosiect blaenoriaeth a gyflwynwyd oedd o fewn ffiniau Cyngor Sir Ddinbych.

Roedd ceisiadau Ffurflenni Sero wedi cael eu cymeradwyo gan y Bwrdd Partneriaeth Rhanbarthol erbyn hyn, ond er ei fod yn cynnig sicrwydd, dywedwyd y byddai hyn ond yn cyfri am 20% o gyfanswm cyllid y prosiect. Hefyd dim ond cam cyntaf y cais oedd hwn ac nid oedd yn warant o unrhyw gyllid.

Ym mis Awst 2023, cyfarfu'r Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol, yr Arweinydd a'r Aelod Arweiniol lechyd a Gofal Cymdeithasol â Chadeirydd dros dro a Phrif Weithredwr BIPBC. Roedd hwn yn gyfarfod buddiol iawn oedd yn canolbwytio ar ddatblygiad prosiect Ysbyty Cymunedol Gogledd Sir Ddinbych. Pwysleisiwyd bod BIPBC wedi ymrwymo i barhau â'r prosiect hyd y pen a'u bod yn parhau i gysylltu â Lywodraeth Cymru er mwyn cyflymu datblygiad y prosiect.

Mynegodd yr Aelod Arweiniol yr angen diymwad i gwblhau'r prosiect hwn, ond bod angen cadw mewn cof y sefyllfa ariannol anodd sy'n ein hwynebu.

Eglurodd y Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol y broses a'r amserlenni ymhellach fel a ganlyn:

- Roedd y Ffurflen Sero (ffurflen gais) bellach wedi cael ei chyflwyno a'i chymeradwyo gan y Bwrdd Partneriaeth Rhanbarthol.
- Bydd Prosiectau Gogledd Cymru sydd wedi cael eu cymeradwyo ar lefel Ffurflen Sero yn cael eu cymeradwyo gan y Bwrdd Partneriaeth Rhanbarthol ac yna eu cyflwyno i Lywodraeth Cymru.

Roedd y wybodaeth ddiweddaraf a roddwyd i'r Pwyllgor yn y cyfarfod yn gam arwyddocaol ymlaen yn y prosiect, ond nid oedd y cyllid wedi'i gymeradwyo gan Lywodraeth Cymru eto.

Rhestrodd Cyfarwyddwr Gweithrediadau'r Gymuned lechyd Integredig y mathau o wasanaethau fyddai yn safle Ysbyty Brenhinol Alexandra a'r disgwyliadau, fel a ganlyn:

Pwysleisiwyd eto ei bod yn hinsawdd ariannol anodd iawn a bod costau'r prosiect wedi newid yn sylweddol. Roedd ar y prosiect cyfalaf angen adolygu'r costau refeniw a dynodi ffynonellau i gau unrhyw fylchau ariannol.

Diolchodd y Cadeirydd i'r Aelod Arweiniol a'r Swyddogion am eu diweddariad cynhwysfawr a chroesawyd cwestiynau gan y Pwyllgor.

Diolchodd yr Aelodau i'r Swyddogion am eu gwaith ar y Prosiect, ond gan fynegi eu siom bod y prosiect hwn wedi cael ei addo i'r gymuned ers cymaint o amser a gofynnwyd am eglurhad am amserlenni'r Prosiect o hyn ymlaen.

Roedd y Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol yn deall rhwystredigaeth y Pwyllgor ond dywedodd nad oedd amserlen ar hyn o bryd o ran pryd fyddai Llywodraeth Cymru yn ymateb i'r Ffurflen Sero y byddai Cyngor Sir Ddinbych yn ei chyflwyno iddynt. Llywodraeth Cymru fyddai'n gyfrifol am bennu dyddiad ar gyfer ystyried y cais wedi iddynt ei dderbyn.

Holodd yr Aelodau pam na chafodd y Pwyllgor adroddiad cyn y cyfarfod, a bod Achos Busnes wedi'i gyflwyno ond nad oedd y Pwyllgor wedi'i weld.

Eglurodd y Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol fod Aelodau'r Pwyllgor wedi bod yn cael y wybodaeth ddiweddaraf am brosiect Ysbyty Cymunedol Gogledd Sir Ddinbych ers blynnyddoedd lawer. Ni chyflwynwyd adroddiad ar gyfer y cyfarfod gan nad oedd unrhyw beth ysgrifenedig i'w rannu ar hyn o bryd.

## **6 ADRODDIAD BLYNYDDOL BWRDD PARTNERIAETH RHANBARTHOL GOGLEDD CYMRU 2022 I 2023**

Cyflwynodd yr Aelod Arweiniol lechyd a Gofal Cymdeithasol Adroddiad Blynnyddol Bwrdd Partneriaeth Rhanbarthol Gogledd Cymru (BPRhGC)

Sefydlwyd Byrddau Partneriaeth Rhanbarthol fel rhan o'r Ddeddf Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol a Llesiant.

Roedd gan y Byrddau Partneriaeth Rhanbarthol ddu nod craidd:

- Gwella lles y boblogaeth.
- Gwella'r ffordd y darperir Gwasanaethau lechyd a Gofal yn y rhanbarth.

Bob blwyddyn, roedd gofyn i Fwrdd Partneriaeth Rhanbarthol Gogledd Cymru lunio adroddiad a'i gyflwyno i Lywodraeth Cymru.

Roedd yr adroddiad ar gyfer 2022-2023 (a ddosbarthwyd ymlaen llaw) yn rhoi trosolwg cynhwysfawr o gyflawniadau ac ymdrechion cyfathrebu ac ymgysylltu yn ogystal â gwybodaeth am flaenorriaethau'r BPRhGC i'r dyfodol.

Oherwydd maint yr adroddiad, gofynnodd yr Aelod Arweiniol a fyddai'n bosibl i'r drafodaeth gael ei hagor i'r Aelodau gyda chymeradwyaeth y Cadeirydd.

Croeswyd cwestiynau gan Aelodau.

Cyfeiriodd Aelodau at y Gronfa Integreiddio Rhanbarthol a amlinellwyd yn yr adroddiad. Roedd prosiectau oedd yn cefnogi gofalwyr yn uniongyrchol yn bwysig, fodd bynnag nododd yr adroddiad bod y cyllid hwn wedi ei roi hyd at 2027. Holodd yr Aelodau a fyddai'r cyllid yn parhau ar ôl y dyddiad hwn. Dywedodd y Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol: Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol ac Addysg, cyn cyflwyno'r Gronfa Integreiddio Rhanbarthol bod Cronfa Gofal Integredig, a ddyrannwyd fesul blwyddyn. Ar hyn o bryd, roedd ymrwymiad o 5 mlynedd i'r cyllid, ond Llywodraeth Cymru fyddai'n penderfynu a fyddai hyn yn parhau ar ôl 2027.

Holodd yr Aelodau am nifer y Byrddau oedd yn gweithredu yn y BPRhGC a'u swyddogaethau. Mynegwyd pryderon am ba mor fawr roedd y BPRhGC yn tyfu. Nododd y Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol fod y BPRhGC yn amgylchedd prysur iawn a bod rheoli cyfarfodydd ac amser cydweithwyr yn cael ei drefnu mor effeithlon â phosibl. Roedd llawer o'r byrddau a'r cyfarfodydd yn ofynnol dan Ddeddf Gwasanaethau Cymdeithasol a Llesiant (Cymru) a roddwyd mwy o gyfrifoldeb ar y Bwrdd Partneriaeth Rhanbarthol yn ystod y blynnyddoedd diwethaf. Mae Swyddogion yn ystyriol bob amser bod Sir Ddinbych a phreswylwyr Sir Ddinbych yn cael y gwerth gorau bosibl o'u cyfranogiad yn y BPRhGC. Roedd elfen statudol i'r Bwrdd Partneriaeth a'r Byrddau sydd yn ymddybodol.

Dyweddodd y Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol wrth yr Aelodau mai adroddiad rhanbarthol oedd yr adroddiad a bod y gofynion o ran sut oedd yn cael ei lunio'n cael eu diffinio gan Lywodraeth Cymru. Felly, nid oedd yr adroddiad mor fanwl am Sir Ddinbych ag yr hoffai Aelodau iddo fod. Os oedd meysydd yn yr adroddiad yr hoffai Aelodau gael mwy o fanylion amdanyst, dywedwyd wrthynt am roi gwybod i swyddogion ac efallai y gellir rhoi'r manylder hwn mewn cyfarfod yn y dyfodol.

Cyfeiriodd Aelodau at y Gronfa Tai â Gofal. Pwrpas y Gronfa oedd cefnogi byw'n annibynnol yn y gymuned i bobl ag anghenion gofal a chymorth, ac i ddarparu safleoedd gofal canolradd yn y gymuned fel y gallai pobl sydd angen gofal, cymorth ac adsefydlu fynd yn ôl i fyw'n annibynnol neu barhau yr un mor annibynnol. Roedd hon yn rhaglen ariannu 4 blynedd oedd yn ariannu cynlluniau dan 3 amcan.

Holodd yr Aelodau am amcan 1 - Cynyddu'r stoc tai â gofal presennol yn sylweddol, gan ofyn os oedd diweddarriad ar hyn yn Sir Ddinbych.

Egluodd y Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol mai ychydig o gynnydd a fu gydag amcan 1 ar hyn o bryd, ond bod hyn yn cael ei adolygu'n barhaus. Roedd prosiectau dan amcanion 2 a 3 o'r adroddiad ar hyn o bryd (a ddosbarthwyd ymlaen llaw). Roedd Sir Ddinbych yn defnyddio eu dyraniad ac yn symud ymlaen gyda'r Gronfa Tai â Gofal.

Holodd yr Aelodau os oedd gwerthusiad o lwyddiant y Byrddau a chanlyniadau'r gwaith oedd ar y gweill. Dywedodd y Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol bod y Byrddau'n cael eu gwerthuso'n drylwyr. Roedd llawer o'r adroddiadau'n rhai statudol oedd yn gorfod cael eu cyflwyno i Lywodraeth Cymru yn cynnwys yr Asesiad o Anghenion y Boblogaeth a'r Adroddiad ar Sefydlogrwydd y Farchnad. Roedd yr adroddiadau hyn yn cael eu gwerthuso pan oeddent yn cael eu cyflwyno i Lywodraeth Cymru. Roedd

y BPRhGC yn destun adolygiadau gan Archwilio Cymru a chynhaliwyd gwerthusiad anffurfiol ac arfer da.

Cyfeiriodd Aelodau at y Cynllun Cyflawni Blynnyddol yn atodiad 2 yr adroddiad (dosbarthwyd ymlaen llaw). Mynegwyd pryderon penodol am ganslo'r Prosiect Gweithlu Tîm Cefnogi Gofal Iechyd, yn y Tîm Nysys Ardal, er ei fod yn gwneud gwahaniaeth clir i nifer y cleifion oedd yn yr ysbyty yn aros am becynnau gofal. Dywedodd y Cyfarwyddwr Corfforaethol fod angen gwneud penderfyniadau anodd yn yr hinsawdd ariannol ar y pryd. Gan fod y tîm hwn yn cael ei ariannu drwy'r Gronfa Integreiddio Rhanbarthol, oedd yn gronfa raddol ble roedd cyllid yn gostwng bob blwyddyn, roedd yn rhaid penderfynu pa flaenoriaethau y gellid eu hariannu yn y dyfodol. Yn anffodus, oherwydd yr hinsawdd ariannol bresennol, byddai angen gwneud penderfyniadau anodd tebyg yn y dyfodol.

Dywedodd Aelodau fod gan Ogledd Cymru y Bwrdd Iechyd mwyaf yn y wlad a bod gan BPRhGC rôl hanfodol yng Ngogledd Cymru. Dywedodd Aelodau nad oedd llawer o breswylwyr yn ymwybodol o BPRhGC a'i bwrpas a holwyd a oedd ffordd o ymgysylltu â chymunedau lleol a rhoi gwybodaeth iddynt am hyn. ### **1. Overall Community Safety Plan Performance summary**

1.1. Of the three main priority areas of work for the Community Safety Partnership at the end of March 2023 two were **Acceptable** and one was **Good**. We have seen an increase in the numbers of Theft and handling, vehicle crime, sexual offences and youth reoffending rate which means priority 1 and 2 have remained acceptable when compared to last year but we have seen reductions in all of the other types of crimes we are required to monitor when compared to the year before.

1.2. Here is a summary position for each Partnership Priority in 2022- March 2023.

## **2. Detailed performance and project/activity progress per Priority Area**

### **2.1. Priority 1- Reduce Crime and Disorder in Denbighshire by working in partnership**

#### **Priority 1 Performance status- Acceptable**

Overall, the performance for the priority is **Acceptable** due to the continued increased numbers of Theft and handling, vehicle crime and sexual offences (Victim Based crimes). The status remains the same as 2021-2022.

#### **Work of the partnership included;**

- Raising awareness of victim-based crimes via social media, attending events and making sure information is available on our websites.
- Home and business surveys carried out by crime reduction advisors and Police Community Support Officers to help prevent burglaries.
- We provided 15 homes with target hardening equipment and crime prevention advice (Locks/door bars etc.)
- We participated in the monthly Multiagency Risk Assessment Conference meeting called MARAC's online where victims of domestic abuse are discussed and where action plans for assistance are put in place.

- Denbighshire sent out numerous press releases on domestic abuse throughout the year led by our Lead Member and we changed the colour of the Pont y Ddraig Bridge to signify the support of the Local Authority on White Ribbon day on the 25<sup>th</sup> of November 2022. The International day is dedicated to raising awareness of domestic abuse and violence against women and girls.
- We promoted the ‘Live fear free All Wales helpline’ received 128 calls from Denbighshire residents. We have been promoting the helpline number at every opportunity.

### **Priority 1 Project/activity update – Good**

We, as a Partnership continued with the work identified in our work plan for 2022-2023. We continued to increase our partnership work on the disruption of organised crime by utilising the individual powers in each organisation. This group helps to provide the police with a rich picture of what’s going on with individuals identified as being involved with organised crime.

Regional meetings continued discussing Modern Day Slavery, County Lines, Integrated Offender Management, Serious Violence, Domestic abuse and substance misuse via the Area Planning Board meetings. There have also been a number of regional operational groups established to help carry forward specific pieces of work. For example preventing terrorism operational group, modern day slavery operational group and serious violence regional task and finish group.

## **2.2. Priority 2- Reducing reoffending**

### **Priority 2 performance status- Acceptable**

Overall the performance for the priority is Acceptable due to the increase in youth reoffending

In 2022-2023 we have seen reductions in adult reoffending in both Denbighshire and Conwy.

In 2022-2023 we had increases in youth reoffending rates. The surge in youth reoffending occurred mid 2022 which has been attributed to coming out of lockdowns after Covid. The Youth Justice Board are aware of the increase in youth offending specifically in the 12-17 age group and are working with the youth offending team and youth services to help prevent further reoffending.

**The work of the partnership is as follows:**

- Local Integrated offender management programmes continues remotely initially and have managed adult offender and those young people transitioning between childhood and adulthood.
- We continued to promote community resolutions and restorative justice when solving minor issues, some of this work was online and the victims of crime found
- We have attended restorative justice conferences where we have acted as the critical friend in the process.
- We are currently working in partnership to identify repeat antisocial behaviour (ASB) offenders
- We have been working closely with the Youth Justice Service and the Youth services in Denbighshire to access some deterrents for young people and some diversionary activities when youth antisocial behaviour issues have been raised with us as a partnership as well as sharing intelligence with the police so that repeat offenders are targeted.
- We have continued with the forum in Rhyl to look at crime and disorder matters. This group has been established as there are a number of issues in the area that require a single coordination point. This is proving to be very successful.

**Priority 2 Project /activity update- Good**

The Community Safety Partnership continued to support the multiagency attendance at the Integrated Offender Management programme and assisting with the actions of that programme. We will continue to assist with the programme, which will also address Organised Crime Groups (OCG's) and County Lines work.

We are now trying more targeted work with young offenders as the numbers are relatively small and we think we can have an impact of diverting the offending behaviour. This work will be ongoing.

Additional projects and focus on diversionary activities have been in focus for youth services and youth justice services in Denbighshire.

The issuing of Yellow Cards and the management of these repeat youth offenders have been used in trying to manage the increase we have seen,

### 2.3. Priority 3- Local Priorities

#### **Priority 3 performance status- Good**

Overall performance of the priority is **Good**

In 2022-2022 we have seen a slight reduction in the number of reports of antisocial behaviour and repeat victims of ASB. The work of the partnership was as follows:

- Establishing local multiagency groups in Denbighshire to manage repeat incidents of Antisocial Behaviour
- Promoting the use of community resolutions to resolve repeat incidents of antisocial behaviour
- Using, when appropriate community protection notices / Public Space Protection Orders
- Control of licenced premises and enforcement and monitoring of taxi licences undertaken by the licensing department.
- Sharing information about online fraud utilising National campaigns especially given the reliance on online platforms for everything.
- Community Tension Monitoring this included hate crime monitoring with the assistance of the Regional cohesion team
- Monitoring of protests and vigils
- Applying for additional third sector funding for additional domestic abuse services locally

#### **Priority 3 Project/activity update- Good**

We will continue to support the monthly Antisocial Behaviour (ASB) tasking meeting which monitors repeat incidents of ASB and provides a multi-agency response to issues raised as well as taking part in restorative justice conferences and promoting community resolutions and mediation when accepted. We participated in raising awareness of Domestic Abuse, Modern Slavery and County Lines locally, the direction for this work comes from the Regional Vulnerability and Exploitation board and the operational subgroups.

Communications internally and externally on domestic abuse, training and early intervention. This work complimented the work of the Regional Vulnerabilities Board and the regional domestic abuse team.

Additional police activity was carried out in the area of the Night Time economy specifically looking at violence against women and girls and increasing safety.

2022-2023 saw a huge increase of referrals to the specialist domestic violence sector, as victims and survivors found the confidence to seek support following the lifting of restrictions linked to the Covid-19 pandemic. Services saw increases of up to 50% across the board and waiting list inevitably increased for some specialist and therapeutic services. However, it was also a year of increased resource, not just from Welsh Government, but funders such as the Ministry of Justice and the Home Office, so North Wales saw the largest amount of Violence against women and sexual violence related funding coming into the region since regionalisation in 2016. The National Training Framework became fully embedded within the annual training plans of the Local Authorities, Health and Fire, with completion rates climbing rapidly. Ask and Act Champions (Group 3 on the framework) were still slow in coming forward, but this has gradually increased over the 12 months. The IRIS pilot in the South Denbighshire cluster of GP surgeries has been a resounding success, with over 100 GPs and staff receiving enhanced training and support to recognise domestic abuse and make referrals for early intervention. We hope to see this rolled out across Conwy and Denbighshire over the next 2 years, although sustainable funding is always a concern given the suspected reduction in budgets. The North Wales Violence Against women domestic abuse and sexual violence Needs Assessment was completed during this period, showing the rapid increase in referrals to the specialist sector and the need for increased join up of funding, to ensure efficient and effective commissioning of services. A wider range of provision is available than ever before, with recovery programmes embedded into the existing provision across the region. Children and Young people affected by violence have been a priority over the last year and there are now specialist Children and Young People's Workers embedded within more of the services than ever before. They offer a wide range of support, including one to one support, as well as play therapy within the refuges and targeted group programmes in many schools across North Wales. The capital funding for disbursed units was used to address a previously unmet need that of families fleeing abuse over the weekend or out of hours. Many families have been forced to stay in local hotels if refuges don't have space and this means they have no kitchen facilities, space for pets etc. There is now a specific building allowing large families to have a real "home" environment, while they wait for appropriate longer term provision. This increases the chances of them making the final move away from abuse, but also gives them the opportunity to function as a family unit within their own space

### **3. Crime Statistics from April 2022 - March 2023**

- 3.1. Conwy statistics included in this report as Denbighshire Scrutiny requested the comparison data some years ago.
- 3.2. The tables below highlight the year-to-date (YTD) volumes of each crime category for the fiscal years 2021/22 and 2022/23. Also included on the chart is the current YTD change in volumes for 2022/23 in comparison to 2021/22:

### 3.3 Denbighshire

3.3.1 In 10 of the 13 crime and incident categories, 2022/23 saw decreases in volumes in Denbighshire. Increases were seen in the remaining 3 categories.

### 3.4 Conwy

3.4.1 In 8 of the 13 crime and incident categories, 2022/23 saw decreases in volumes in Conwy. Increases were seen in the remaining 5 categories.

### **3.5 Violence Offences**

3.5.1 Violence with Injury offences decrease seen in Denbighshire whilst Conwy saw an increase  
**(Denbighshire -1.7% decrease -23 crimes) and (Conwy 3.3% Increase +45 crimes),**

3.5.2 Violence without Injury offences decreased in both counties  
**(Denbighshire -3.9% decrease -87 crimes) and (Conwy -4.4% decrease -102 crimes),**

### **3.6 Stalking & Harassment**

3.6.1 Significant decreases in the volume of stalking and harassment offences were seen in both counties. Home Office recording changes in April 2020 to the category of Stalking & Harassment led to initial large increases across the force, and nationally, however the volumes levelled out over the past couple of years and now decreases are being seen.  
**(Denbighshire -14.4% decrease 286 crimes) and (Conwy -13.1% decrease -271 crimes),**

### **3.7 Sexual Offences**

3.7.1 Sexual Offences have increased in both counties in 2022/23 in comparison to 2021/22. These increases have been seen across the whole of North Wales. As part of a national review of how police forces record and investigate sexual offences (Op SOTERIA), North Wales Police are currently in the process of completing a Rape and Serious Sexual Offences problem profile, to better understand the nature of rape and sexual offences and utilise the knowledge to thoroughly investigate suspects and better support victims.  
**(Denbighshire +4.3% increase +22 crimes) and (Conwy +5.4% in increase 26 crimes)**

### **3.8 Acquisitive Crime (*Burglary Residential, Burglary Business & Community, Robbery, Vehicle Crime and Theft & Handling*)**

3.8.1 Conwy saw an increase in Burglary Residential offences in 2022/23 in comparison, whereas Denbighshire experienced a decrease in volumes.

**(Denbighshire -14.1% decrease -38 crimes) and (Conwy +20.1% increase of +48 crimes)**

3.8.2 **Burglary Business & Community** offences rose in Conwy, however due to the low volume of offences, the increase equates to just 18 offences more than the previous year. Denbighshire experienced a reduction in 2022/23.

**(Denbighshire -15.2% decrease of -17 crimes) and (Conwy +15.1% increase of +18 crimes)**

3.8.3 **Vehicle crime** saw a significant decrease in Conwy in 2022/23, however there was an increase in offences in Denbighshire. In terms of volume, there were an additional 23 vehicle crimes in

Rhyl in 2022/23 compared to 2021/22. A spate of 16 vehicle crimes in January 2023 in St Asaph also contributed to the increases seen in Denbighshire. A male has since been arrested and charged with these offences.

**(Denbighshire +23.9% increase +43 crimes) and Conwy (-36.2% decrease -84 crimes)**

3.8.4 **Theft & Handling** increased in both counties in 2022/23. This category contains Shoplifting, where increases in offences have been seen over recent months, particularly in Conwy. There is also an increasing number of *Making off without payment* offences in each county, again to a larger extent in Conwy: We often see increases of this kind when there are cost of living issues in communities.

**(Denbighshire increase 6.7% +96 crimes) and (Conwy increase 17.9% increase +231 crimes)**

### **3.9 Criminal Damage and Arson**

3.9.1 Criminal damage and Arson in both Conwy and Denbighshire decreased in 2022/23 in comparison to last year. These decreases are in line with the trend being seen across the force area.

**(Denbighshire -2.5% decrease -28 crimes) and (Conwy -6% decrease -81 crimes)**

### **3.10 Domestic Crime**

3.10.1 There have been decreases in the volume of domestic crimes for both counties in 2022/23 compared to last year. These decreases have also been seen across North Wales.

**(Denbighshire -7.2% decrease -182 crimes) and (Conwy -4% decrease -106 crimes)**

### **3.11 Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)**

3.11.1 Conwy and Denbighshire experienced decreases in ASB volumes in 2022/23 compared to 2021/22. Recent requests for analysis have highlighted issues around youth related ASB across North Wales.

3.11.2 Repeat victims of ASB, repeat locations where ASB is occurring, and high-risk vulnerable victims are referred for review to monthly multi-agency tasking groups.

**(Denbighshire -6.4% decrease -166 crimes) and (Conwy -8.2% decrease -276 crimes)**



## **Appendix 2- Community Safety Partnership work ongoing in Denbighshire 2023-2024**

### **Summary**

- 2.1 We will continue to work regionally to access additional funding for third sector domestic abuse services and to make sure the support services we have are as robust as they can be to cope with the increases we are seeing.
- 2.2 We will continue with our problem solving approach to antisocial behaviour. It would appear from the number of multiagency meetings we have arranged and participated in that this is the best way to deal with repeat incidents is to bring everyone together and update those suffering from ASB on a regular basis to ensure they are consulted and updated.
- 2.3 Youth ASB has been a focus over the last 12 months and will continue to be so. We are working collectively to identify those who are continuously causing issue in our communities.
- 2.4 We are anticipating a rise in all crime areas over the next year due to socio-econominc issues communities are facing. There are discussions about preventing crimes ongoing regionally, such as campiagns about securing properties and businesses accross the County. The Roll out of a police intiative 'We Don't Buy Crime' will help focus our partnerhsip activity on reducing the theft and handling category of crime.

### **Specific initiatives for 2023-24**

#### **2.5 We Don't Buy Crime**

2.5.1 'We Don't Buy Crime' is an initiative partnering with communities and businesses to minimise crime specifically where we have seen our increases in Denbighshire. Focussing on;

- Burglary
- Robbery
- Theft
- Vehicle crime

These are crimes where the offender profits from the crime. They're collectively known as 'acquisitive crime'.

2.5.2 We will continue assisting the Rural Crime Team in the police with the promotion of crime prevention measures and the use of smartwater a bespoke DNA address identification liquid for high value farm items such as quad bikes and target hardening measures. As we enter a period of economic uncertainty history shows us these types of crimes will increase as these

items are very valuable and sought after on the black market. This will also form part of the initiative above with specific work being done with farming communities.

2.5.3 As an authority we also have to develop a Serious Violence Strategy by January 2024. We are working regionally on the strategy with the support from the Police and Crime Commissioner's Office. The Crime Commissioner has been allocated specific funding for the development of this strategy across North Wales.

2.5.4 The Serious Violence Duty will require local authorities, the police, fire and rescue authorities, specified criminal justice agencies and health authorities to work together to formulate an evidence-based analysis of the problems associated with serious violence in a local area, and then produce and implement a strategy detailing how they will respond to those particular issues. Prisons, youth custody agencies and educational authorities may also need to work with these core partners.

2.5.5 As a result of this duty the police, local authorities, fire and rescue authorities, and specified health and criminal justice agencies will have to work together to identify and publish what actions they need to take collectively to reduce violent crime, including domestic abuse and sexual offences. Educational authorities, prisons and youth custody agencies may also be required to work with those bodies as a result of this duty. The legislation grants these authorities the power to share data and information with each other for the purpose of preventing and reducing serious violence. We are being encouraged to place an emphasis on early intervention with young people in order to prevent them from becoming either a victim or perpetrator of serious violence in the first place. Partnerships already work well in tackling serious violence and the Home Office wants to build on this good practice so that it is more consistent across England and Wales.

## **2.6 Clear, Hold, Build - a police/partnership initiative.**

2.6.1 Alongside the serious violence duty strategy development there is something called Clear, Hold, Build a police/partnership initiative. **The initiative aims to:**

- Tackle organised crime groups (OCGs) acting in the neighbourhood
- Build community resilience
- Improve confidence and trust in the police
- Make the area a safer place to live

2.6.2 This is achieved through three flexibly deployed phases of activity – Clear, Hold and Build (CHB).

- **Clear**

The clear phase involves initial targeted enforcement activity (arrests and relentless disruption) that target OCG members, their networks, business interests, criminality, and spheres of influence. The police use all powers and levers to impact on their ability to operate, creating safer spaces to begin restoring community confidence.

- **Hold**

The hold phase involves consolidating and stabilising the initial clear phase to stop remaining or other OCG members capitalising on the vacuum created.

This phase aims to improve community confidence by ensuring spaces remain safe. Visible neighbourhood policing in hot spot areas is used to provide continuing reassurance.

- **Build**

The build phase involves a whole-system approach to delivering community-empowered interventions that tackle drivers of crime, exploitation of vulnerabilities and hotspots of harm.

This phase aims to:

Improve engagement with services

Increased confidence within the community

2.6.3 Greater reporting through to police and partnerships through continued neighbourhood policing and partnership working

2.6.4 Intended outcome of Clear, Hold, Build in a high crime area

- The activity focuses on reducing the activity of organised crime in the area and improving community safety and confidence in the police. This is likely to initially increase reporting of crime and enable further problem solving to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour.

## **2.7 Safer Streets 5 Fund - Managed by the Police and Crime Commissioners Office and North Wales Police**

2.7.2 Bid awaiting formal written approval by the Home Office (end of September/beginning of October 2023)-Project will be completed by March 2025.

2.7.3 The thematic areas of focus for Safer Streets 5 are: Antisocial behaviour, Violence against Women and Girls (in public settings) and Neighbourhood Crime (specifically residential burglary, vehicle crime, street Robbery etc.).

2.7.4 The executive management of the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner and North Wales Police were keen to ensure that the funding was utilised on a need basis and so it was important that applications were made in line with the

demand and risk profile our data indicated and not allocated geographically just because an area hadn't yet received any Safer Streets funding.

2.7.5 Clarification from Home Office stated that 3 thematic projects would be acceptable with the areas of high crime being targeted.

2.7.6 In determining the areas of need the following data sets were analysed:

- Recorded incidents under each theme / 1000 population across preceding 5 years including 5 year mean value.
- Recorded incidents under each theme / 1000 population for the most recent whole recording year vs 5 yr mean value to indicate increase or decrease in demand / risk.
- Community SOC (Serious and Organised Crime) profiles. These detail the number of OCGs (Organised Crime Groups) resident within and active within each local Policing area and makes comment at ward levels.
- Local Policing district Violence Against women and Girls profiles. This provides more of a narrative in respect of the makeup of Violence Against women and girls offending within a Local Policing District, highlighting the nature of offending, specific hot-spot areas and merging / escalating risks.
- Are profiles detailing offences relevant to the Serious Violence Duty (Partnership)

2.7.7 Across these data sets and all 3 thematic areas of focus for Safer Streets 5 Rhyl West 2 came out as the highest demand and highest risk area. Therefore Rhyl West 2 (and Rhyl West as a ward) will benefit from interventions across each of the 3 thematic projects.

2.7.8 Rhyl West 2 (and Rhyl West as a ward) interventions subject to Home Office approval will be as follows:

- Thematic Area 1- Neighbourhood Crime in Residential areas, Vehicle crime and street robbery

Target hardening packs to all residential premises within the area identified (including Smart Water, Ring Door bells and / or security lights, signage, and bespoke crime prevention advice).

Access to online interactive crime prevention tools, including home security (interactive 3D residential property) and vehicle security.

NWP dedicated We Don't Buy Crime officers providing in person crime prevention and engagement days monthly within the targeted area for the life of the project.

New CCTV server for Denbighshire at a cost of £93K to support the planned upgrade of CCTV infrastructure (already commissioned using Shared Prosperity funding). The server is required to support the new modern HD cameras and essentially future proof the local CCTV network.

- Thematic Area 2 -Antisocial Behaviour

Liverpool Football Club Foundation Onside Project (LFC Foundation)/ County Lines School programme. This will support either 2 secondary schools or if run from the local PRU will support all Secondary schools servicing the Rhyl West area (and feeder primary schools), through the provision of a full time LFC Foundation youth worker. The programme offers high risk / high demand students alternative curriculum activities designed to build essential skills, improve consequential thinking, develop respect and community ownership and increase health and wellbeing. The programme runs through multiple cohorts of young people that will be referred into the scheme via a multi-agency triage panel. The programme will also provide interventions in respect of Child Criminal Exploitation, in particular County Lines, which is of particular relevance to Rhyl West. The programme has delivered significant success in other areas demonstrating similar issues. The total cost is £90K, all of which is covered by Safer Streets Fund 5

Eagle House Community Interest Company. This intervention delivers a high intensity programme to develop confidence, essential skills for life such as mutual respect, team working, community ownership and consequential thinking through a 2 day introduction followed by 5 day residential training programme in the Eryri National Park. Each course will cater for 8 young people. The area of Rhyl West will essentially benefit from 2 courses. The first will target those considered hardest to reach and engage in respect of the LFC foundation programme above, therefore intending to act as a springboard into engagement with this longer term initiative. The second course will be available to Denbighshire Youth Justice Service who hi-light an increasingly high volume of late teenage / school leavers in the area in crisis as so much as they are reliant on supported housing, have little employment prospects and subject of criminal exploitation. Again this is a proven intervention delivered by skilled professionals.

- Thematic Area 3 -Violence Against women and Girls

A stalking coordinator role will be established within North Wales Police. This is to address NWP being an outlier in respect of the high volume of harassment and stalking offences recorded, and the low level of detections and other offender based control measures such as Stalking Prevention Orders and Sexual Harm orders being applied for and imposed upon offenders. The work of this staff member will focus on the Rhyl west area along with the other areas highlighted as part of this project. They will support investigations and train colleagues with the intended outcome of a higher output of positive outcomes in terms of reported crimes, increased offender management, decreased repeat offending and increased quality of service for victims.

## **2.8 Don't Steal My future**

- 2.8.1 This is a project delivered by the Rape and Sexual Abuse Support Centre in North Wales. This is the second of their award winning programme that has been re-worked from a target group of year 11 and above, to year 8 and 9 pupils. It is redesigned to ensure it is age appropriate and will be delivered into all secondary schools servicing the project areas. Included in this training is additional support training and materials for school staff to deal with related disclosures made to them and to support young people seeking advice re these issues.
- 2.8.2 All students will be given this input in the relevant age range. The input is offender focussed and of particular importance as we see a trend in violence against women and girls offences occurring in our schools increasing. The project tackles in addition to consent, the impact that online influences and the ready access to and use of pornography has on young people's behaviours and relationships and how this impacts lives in the long term.
- 2.8.3 North Wales Police have secured a by-stander training product having worked with Professor Adam Winstock from University College in London and Welsh Women's Aid. We will be investing Safer Streets funds into having this translated into a further 6 languages based upon the demographics of our local communities alongside an existing support booklet. Members of the NWP Violence Against Women team will with our regional Community Cohesion partners undertake outreach activities into our hard to reach minority communities. We will deliver the by-stander training initially to key community figures and subsequently hold an open session for community members in a space familiar to them and considered culturally appropriate and in their preferred / first language. We therefore anticipate there will be multiple sessions within the Rhyl area catering for the hard to engage / minority communities within the town. The intent is to make clear what constitutes an offence, the need for community members to step in and protect their friends, family and community and how they can safely do this. We seek to build trust within these communities in respect of NWP, us in Local Authorities and our third sector partners and intend to have appropriate representation at each delivery so demonstrating the support and safe spaces victims can access.



### **Appendix 3: Community Safety Partnership - Further information on funding.**

#### **1. Financial Sources of the Partnership**

- 1.1. The Partnership receives no direct grant funding to manage/ allocate. The funding from the Home office and Welsh Government is all given directly to the North Wales Police and Crime Commissioner to commission crime and disorder services/and projects across North Wales.
- 1.2. We are able to access some of the funding allocated to the commissioner from the Home Office Safer Streets fund and Serious Violence fund for local projects by working with the office of the crime commissioner on regional bids.
- 1.3. Regional Domestic Abuse funding from the Welsh Government and Ministry of Justice are also managed by the Office of the Crime Commissioner.

#### **2. Community Safety Team and funding sources**

- 2.1. Community Safety Manager- working across Denbighshire and Conwy. Half of the costs each funded by Denbighshire and Conwy via Local Authority revenue funding. Joint manager post created July 2008
- 2.2. 1/3 of a partnership statistical crime analyst (based within North Wales Police) – funded by revenue funding in both Local authorities- regional agreement began 2008 and is reviewed every three years by the Safer North Wales Partnership Board.
- 2.3. North Wales Substance Misuse Coordinator- based with the Community Safety Team Grant funded by The Area Planning Board substance misuse funding from the Welsh Government- Post in place since 2006 post classed as permanent.

## 4. Manylion yr adroddiad

- 4.1 Mae Adran 7 Cyfansoddiad Cyngor Sir Ddinbych yn nodi cylch gorchwyl, swyddogaethau ac aelodaeth pob Pwyllgor Craffu, yn ogystal â rheolau gweithdrefnau a trafodaethau.
- 4.2 Mae'r Cyfansoddiad yn amodi bod yn rhaid i bwylgorau craffu'r Cyngor osod, ac adolygu'n rheolaidd, rhaglen ar gyfer eu gwaith i'r dyfodol. Trwy adolygu a blaenoriaethu materion, gall aelodau sicrhau bod y rhaglen waith yn cyflwyno agenda a arweinir gan yr aelodau.
- 4.3 Arfer sydd wedi'i fabwysiadu yn Sir Ddinbych ers nifer o flynyddoedd yw bod pwylgorau craffu'n cyfyngu ar nifer yr adroddiadau a ystyri mewn unrhyw gyfarfod i uchafswm o bedwar, yn ogystal ag adroddiad rhaglen waith y Pwyllgor ei hun. Nod y dull hwn yw hwyluso trafodaeth fanwl ac effeithiol ar bob pwnc.
- 4.4 Yn y blynnyddoedd diweddar mae Llywodraeth Cymru (LIC) ac Archwilio Cymru wedi tynnu sylw at yr angen i gryfhau rôl craffu ar draws llywodraeth leol a gwasanaethau cyhoeddus yng Nghymru, gan gynnwys defnyddio craffu fel modd o ymgysylltu â phreswylwyr a defnyddwyr gwasanaeth. O hyn allan, disgwylir i graffu ymgysylltu'n well ac yn amlach â'r cyhoedd gyda bwriad i sicrhau penderfyniadau gwell a fydd yn y pen draw yn arwain at well canlyniadau i ddinasyyddion. Bydd Archwilio Cymru yn mesur effeithiolrwydd craffu wrth gyflawni'r disgwyliadau hyn.

  - arbedion ar y gyllideb;
  - cyflawni Themau y Cynllun Corfforaethol (gyda phwyslais arbennig ar y modd o'u cyflawni yn ystod cyfnod o galedi ariannol);


