The proposal is to continue to bid for Safe Routes in Communities funding to fund future projects to increase levels of walking and cycling and reduce car usage. The aim of Safe Routes projects is to improve accessibility for pedestrians, cyclists and those with mobility impairments, thereby reducing reliance on the private car.

Communities Scrutiny Committee have requested a paper to discuss the administration of the Safe Routes in Communities initiative, including an analysis of any problems that have been encountered. No specific consultation has been undertaken for the development of this paper as a high level of community engagement is undertaken during the development of every individual SRIC project. Indeed, it is essential that evidence of such engagement can be fully

demonstrated when funding applications are submitted to the Welsh Government as a failure to demonstrate this level of consultation is likely to see applications fail.

Each Safe Routes in Communities project will need to be assessed on a scheme specific basis as there will be many different elements to each scheme which can affect individuals differently. However, although it is only possible to generalise when discussing the SRIC project as a whole, it can be said that SRIC projects mostly have a positive impact in terms of their impact on people with mobility impairments. It is suggested that the majority of projects would have a neutral impact in terms of the other protected characteristics.

As referred to in No. 5 above, each scheme would be assessed on an individual basis although there would be little negative impact for those with mobility impairments.
