The proposal is to revise the Council's Parking Policy which was last updated in 1996. One of the main changes to the new Policy is that a greater emphasis has been placed on the role that parking can play in supporting the vitality of town centres. The requirement for the provision of disabled bays in car parks has also been upgraded to reflect the minimum standards suggested in the Department for Transport document, "Inclusive Mobility".

The new policy is essentially an update of the old parking policy. The drafting of the revised policy has been undertaken jointly between staff from Highways & Environmental Services and staff from Business & Economic Development.

The new policy has updated the requirement for disabled bays so that it complies with the 2002 Department for Transport document "Inclusive Mobility".

The new policy also states that dropped kerbs are to be provided adjacent to new disabled bays, wherever possible.

These two revisions to the parking policy will have a positive impact on provision for those with impaired mobility.
