- i) **Air Quality** - No specific additional air quality monitoring was undertaken as a result of the fire. We have NO₂ (Nitrogen Dioxide) tubes located around Llangollen town centre which undertake routine air quality monitoring in that area. These did not show any changes during the period of the fire that we could attribute to the fire itself. No complaints relating to air quality issues as a result of the fire were received.
- ii) **Private water Supplies** - We had no contact/complaints from any private water supply users in the area relating to contamination issues. There were a few issues in relation to the dry weather but not specifically as a response to the fire. Denbighshire County Council (DCC) press office did advertise that residents could contact us for help and advice on securing an alternative supply via social media.
- iii) **Mains Water Supplies** - To the best of our knowledge, mains water supplies were not affected. If they had been Dŵr Cymru/Welsh Water would have been responsible for supplying emergency water supplies to affected households. WW/DW have not raised any issues with ourselves relating to supplies during this period.
