



Appendix 5 – Conwy & Denbighshire Well-Being Plan 2023-28: Overview of Consultation Responses

The consultation was launched on the 17 August 2022 and closed on the 9 November 2022. It ran for 12 weeks in line with the statutory guidance for PSBs.

It was circulated to the following statutory consultees, including:

Consultation responses

Overall responses to the consultation were unfortunately low. In total we received:

- 10 responses from the online survey
- Feedback from the Conwy & Denbighshire Joint Scrutiny Committee, Future Generations Commissioners Office, Welsh Government, Natural Resources Wales
- Majority of the respondents agreed with our outcome of tackling deprivation and inequality, with further comments received including:
