This project proposes to enable year-round events to occur within the Square, which would also be made safer for all pedestrians and cyclists without compromising on vehicular access and parking. The scheme has been designed to improve access for cyclist and pedestrians to the town centre and to diminish the through traffic within the square, hence creating a more usable, safe space for shopping and tourism. This should in turn help to support local businesses and create greater economic benefits within the town centre.
